I Ann Sechart of Howard County and State of Maryland do hereby manumit and set free my neys slaves to wit, Ann Henson aged twenty five

years on the eighteenth day of November 1856. to serve ten years from the eighteenth day of November 1856. with her child Sam aged four years on the eighth day of March fifteen hundred and fifty six. to serve until he arrive at the age of forty years, Annaline Jordan aged twenty two years. the fifteenth day of May eighteen hundred and fifty six
