 Baltimore County, and State aforesaid, of the other part,
 Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of
 twelve hundred and fifty dollars, lawful money of the
 United States in hand paid by the said Thomas Sansdale
 to the said Anna Maria Ogle (Guardian as aforesaid) at
 or before the enrolling and delivery of these presents the
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained
 and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain sell
 and convey unto the said Thomas Sansdale his executors,
 administrators and assigns, one negro or man named
 Lucretia aged about thirty five years, one negro girl
 named Lucretia, aged about eight years, one negro
 boy named Brent aged about seven years, one negro
 girl named Agnes, three years old, and one negro
 child named Anne, two years old, Slaves for life, and
 the children of the said Lucretia. To have and to hold
 the said negroes slaves for life unto the said Thomas
 Sansdale his heirs, executors, administrators and
 assigns forever. And the said Anna Maria Ogle
 (Guardian as aforesaid) for herself, her heirs, executors
 and administrators do covenant and agree to and
 with the said Thomas Sansdale to warrant and
 defend the sale of the said negroes slaves for life
 hereby sold unto the said Thomas Sansdale his
 executors administrators and assigns, against all
 and every person and persons whomsoever. In witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 eleventh day of April in the year one thousand eight
 hundred and fifty four.
