Now the condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound E. A. Talbot shall well and faithfully execute his office as collector of the State taxes and shall well and truly account for and pay over to the Treasurer of the State of Maryland the several sums of money which he shall receive or be answerable at such times as the law directs, then this obligation to be null and void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
