

Mr. Brown from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution in favor of Edward Thompson, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

His Excellency Governor Veazey appeared in the Senate Chamber.

The engrossed bills of the Senate from No. 250 to No. 285 inclusive, and No. 311, were read and assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of Delegates returned said bills, endorsed "read and assented to," and delivered the engrossed bills of the house of delegates from No. 90 to No. 294, inclusive, and from No. 286 to No. 310 inclusive,

Which were read and assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

It was ordered that Mr. Jones and Mr. Schley inform the house of delegates that his Excellency Governor Veazey is now in the Senate Chamber to sign the engrossed bills and invite their attendance to witness the ceremony.

Mr. Jones and Mr. Schley retired, and after a time returned and reported that they had discharged the duty assigned them.

Accordingly the honorable speaker and members of the house of delegates appeared, when his Excellency Governor Veazey signed the engrossed bills from No. 90 to No. 311 inclusive, in presence of the General Assembly in conformity with the requirements of the constitution and laws.

The honorable speaker and members of the house of delegates retired.

His Excellency Governor Veazey also retired.

The president rose and tendered his acknowledgments to the senate for the resolution which had been adopted in regard to the manner in which he had discharged the duties of the chair, and,

The Senate adjourned until the last Monday in December next,
