PREFACE

This study is a part of the project started in the spring of 1937 by the American Imprints Inventory, a division of the Historical Records Survey program of the Works Progress Administration. The purpose of the project was to make a permanent record of existing American imprints from the earliest days of American printing to the year 1876. The preliminary tasks in compiling such a record were done by the WPA Writers' Project Workers who prepared and sent to the Library of Congress bibliographic information about individual items found in libraries throughout the country. This information was prepared on 3 x 5 cards which were stored under the care of the National Union Catalog at the Library of Congress, in files arranged by state and year of imprint.

It has been the purpose of this study to prepare in readily usable form a section of this imprint record, specifically, the imprints of the state of Maryland for 1859.

The introduction to the study presents sketches of national and Maryland history in the 1850's, together with an account of printing and publishing in the period concerned. This is offered as a background of events, persons, and circumstances which produced the types of material contained in the list of imprints.

The checklist comprises the main portion of the study. It represents, in edited form, the information contained on the original 3 x 5 cards held by the National Union Catalog. The data offered by these cards were first organized to bring together information as complete as possible on each item. As nearly as practicable the various items were then identified and verified by searching in the National Union Catalog, in the Library of Congress catalog, and in bibliogra-

phies, and through some correspondence with holding libraries. The checklist is arranged by main entry in a single alphabetical sequence. To assure uniformity of presentation, the American Library Association's Cataloging Rules for Author and Title Entries was followed for form and choice of entry, and the Library of Congress' Rules for Descriptive Cataloging for the description of the individual items. One exception will be found in the inclusion of both publisher and printer in the imprint of items for which both were given. Symbols of libraries reported as possessing a copy of the various items are appended to each entry. A key to these symbols will be found immediately preceding the checklist. Newspapers and periodicals being published in Maryland in 1859 form a separate alphabetical listing following the main checklist. Material for this listing was gathered largely, though not totally, from Winifred Gregory's American newspapers, 1821-1936.

In section V and VI an analysis of the imprints is presented in a complete list of the printers and/or publishers with the number of items issued by each and an alphabetical accounting by form of the material in the checklist, giving the number of items under each form.

To facilitate the location of individual items within the checklist, the study is concluded with a complete author-title-subject index. The subject entries are distinguished by the use of capital letters throughout.

I wish to acknowledge my gratitude to those who in any way were helpful in the course of this work, especially those members of the staff of the Maryland Historical Society library with whom I came in contact, and Miss M. Gardner of the National Union Catalog staff for her patient consideration.

INTRODUCTION

A. The Nation in the 1850's

Despite the conflict in the political sphere and the national unrest arising over the slavery issue, the 1850's in this nation have been recorded as a decade of such prosperity and growth as Americans had previously not known. The industrial revolution was in full sway in the northeastern sector of the young republic and the figures for industrial output had steadily risen throughout the first half of the century, overtaking and finally, in 1859, passing our gross agricultural product.¹ The bulk of our industrial wealth in this period lay in textile manufacturing, our leading industry by 1860. Statistics for the twenty-year period ending with 1860 show that the consumption of southern cotton by the mills of the northeast had almost quadrupled. In the South "King Cotton" was producing a wealth beyond expectation, over one hundred million dollars annually.²

Moving from the east coast westward, one would find that industry was gradually settling also in the midwest, as the smoke from Chicago factories evidenced industrial growth, while further to the west were the prosperous wheat-fields of Wisconsin, Iowa and Minnesota.

By mid-century the country had already pushed its way into the far west and was bordering on the Pacific. The lure of gold had drawn many to the California territory in 1849 and in the years that followed gold flowed from the mines of California at a rate of fifty million dollars a year.³

It was also an era of domestic and foreign investment in American railroad stock. During the decade the network of our railroads increased three times over

the mileage of track that had been laid during the previous twenty years. The total mileage of railroads extending from the Atlantic to the Mississippi was thirty thousand miles by 1860.⁴

The 1850's saw a continuing wave of immigration to this country from the famine- and war-stricken countries of Ireland, England, Germany and the Scandinavian peninsula. Some of the immigrants settled in the rapidly expanding West but the majority swelled our city populations and added to the ranks of the growing class of skilled industrial workers.

The decade was not one of total prosperity however. An economic crisis occurred in the fall of 1857. Although this panic does not measure as one of the major declines in the nation's economic history, there was bankruptcy, depression, and much misery and discontent. The factors that led to the panic are seen in extravagant expenditures in railroad construction, reckless speculation in land and commodities, swollen imports, a weak banking system and the European war that was drawing funds from the American market.⁵ Complete recovery did not come till 1860.

Much of what has been said of industrialization characterized especially the Northeastern section of the republic. A social evolution could be detected at this time in the Northeast. The reins were yet in the hands of a middle class society of yeoman farmers, village artisans, storekeepers, and some professional men, but there was arising a proletariat of wage earners, largely immigrant, without property and unrooted, who quickly outnumbered the self-employed.

As it had been characterized from the beginning the West was at this time a vast area of plentiful opportunity and general prosperity. Its people were insistent on social and political equality and had a distaste for the aristocratic strata of the South. Here national loyalty was held in high regard. Not only the

factory smoke of the East but also the philosophy of profit was becoming noticeable as large areas of farmland were being worked for gain now rather than for subsistence alone. Farmers looked to newly-manufactured machinery as a means to insure their margin of profit as laborers moved either further west or toward the growing cities.

The plantation life of the South presented a rather static picture in comparison with the East and West. Southern ideals were grounded in a spirit of aristocracy and conservatism, and the desire to preserve this way of life was reflected in the South's insistence on state rights, most strikingly seen in the southern stand on the issue of slavery.

The 1850's, the years preceding the principal crisis in our country's history are forever marked by the turbulent and at times bloody controversy over this question of slavery. As the North advanced in industry, in living standard, in population, in the spirit of the modern world which believed in the individual and in free enterprise, and as the South became more determined to its aristocratic conservatism, encouraged by the wealth of the plantation, and more resentful toward the northern middlemen who grew wealthy on southern cotton, the wedge that was temporarily to split the Union was being driven ever deeper.

The slavery controversy was not new in 1850. The newspaper, The Liberator, and secret escape routes to Canada, the "underground railroad", were known for two decades previously to the open struggles of the '50's over the great Compromise, championed in the Senate by Henry Clay and Stephen A. Douglas, and the debates over the Kansas-Nebraska Act. It was Douglas who raised the theory of "popular sovereignty", disparagingly called "Squatter sovereignty", whereby the people themselves should determine the fate of slavery in their territory.

The slavery antagonism split the leading political parties, the Whigs and

the Democrats, bringing a political regrouping along the lines of sectional beliefs. The new Republican and Democratic parties took form and those dissatisfied with both grouped into the emerging Know-Nothing party which figured so prominently in the political corruption that prevailed in Maryland in the later 1850's. The Republicans did well in the election of 1856 but were defeated by the Democratic ticket of James Buchanan and John Cabell Breckinridge, a ticket little tainted by the slavery question.

The tone of ill-will over slavery reached a new crescendo in 1857, when the issue came before the U. S. Supreme Court in the form of the Dred Scott vs. Sandford case. A prominent lawyer and former U. S. Senator from Annapolis, Md., Reverdy Johnson, represented the defense in this case. According to the decision of Justice Roger B. Taney, Congress could not under the Constitution exclude slavery from the territories. News items the morning after the Dred Scott decision were alarming. "Slavery Alone National -- The Missouri Compromise Unconstitutional -- Negroes Cannot Be Citizens -- The Triumph of Slavery Complete."⁶

With this decision the South felt its position strengthened and it continued to proclaim the rights of slaveholders in the new territories to the West.

Southern determinism was further strengthened by an event of late 1859 that was considered the culmination of abolitionist moves. This was the October 17th raid of John Brown on the arsenal at Harper's Ferry. This incident and its outcome aroused great excitement in both North and South. Many in the North thought Brown a martyr to the cause of freedom; in the South, however, the raid was interpreted as a clear sign of northern desires, not only for the curtailment of slavery in the territories, but for its total abolition. The raid resulted in a closer unity of southern intent.

The moderates on both sides were losing ground in their fight for the

peaceful solution of differences within the constitutional framework. Nevins finds the reason for this in the fact that it was a time of stubborn self-confidence and egotism borne of economic success and prosperity. In both North and South "large bodies of pushing, successful men were more ready to bluff their way, spurn compromise and trust to luck than if times had been sterner and failure more frequent."⁷

So stood the nation as it approached the threshold of the 60's, perhaps the most critical decade of our country's domestic history, a decade which saw the desire for national unity, though strained to the point of breaking, prevail.

B. Maryland in the 1850's

The history of Maryland for the 1850's is typical of the spirit of progress and prosperity that characterized the nation as a whole. According to Henry Onderdonk in his History of Maryland, the financial panic of 1837 had hit Maryland as hard as other parts of the country; but while Governor Thomas Pratt and his successor, Philip Francis Thomas, were in office the state debt was gradually decreased and the credit of Maryland reaffirmed. By 1848 the value of property was redoubled, the pace of internal improvements had been reestablished, agriculture and manufacturing were flourishing and growing.¹

At the same time, commercial activity was on the increase. Newly constructed clipper ships were to be seen in the port of Baltimore, new links with foreign ports for the export of large quantities of tobacco and flour, the two most important products of Maryland farms, in return for imported valuables from the West Indies and South America, such as, coffee, sugar, copper, guano, and hides. Also, Baltimore's shipping link with ports of the southern states brought raw cotton for the growing northern textile industry in exchange for manufactured goods and fertilizers. The latter were products of the relatively new and growing Baltimore fertilizer industry, which took great steps forward with the first shipment of guano landed at Baltimore in 1843 to be sold on a trial basis. Such great enthusiasm arose over increased farm yield that, by 1860, 54, 134 tons of guano were imported at Baltimore for that year alone and still the demand exceeded the supply.²

The growth of the fertilizer industry might well be linked to the new interest in agricultural study and investigation. It was in 1848 that the General Assembly set up the position of State Agricultural Chemist, and in 1855 the assem-

bly passed an act providing for a State Agricultural College. The cornerstone of the college was laid on August 24, 1858.³

The increased yield of the farms found ready transportation to coastal markets by way of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad and the C & O Canal. Both of these projects were started in 1824, and although the C & O Canal from its establishment had proved somewhat of a disappointment, yet in 1850 it was an important channel for goods transported from Cumberland to Georgetown and the nation's capital. The growth of the B & O Railroad now afforded a new and valued link with the states to the west. Under the supervision of Thomas Swann, president of the railroad from 1847 to 1853, and Benjamin Latrobe, the B & O had been constructed as far as the Ohio River by New Year's day, 1853, and by 1857 the railway had been completed as far as the Mississippi Valley.⁴ In November of 1858 John W. Garrett became the 33rd president of the railroad (at a salary of 4000 dollars a year). The first annual report to be signed by him was that of October 1, 1859. At this time the B & O included the "main stem" and two branches, the Washington branch and the Parkersburg branch (the Northwestern Virginia Railroad).

By 1858 the port city of Maryland was a thriving metropolis. In that year Baltimore was passed by Philadelphia in size, but yet, as the third largest city of the nation, Baltimore had a population in 1858 of 212,418.⁵ It was a city busy with the motion of growth accelerated in the 1850's by the arrival of new immigrants from Germany and Ireland. At the beginning of the decade the people of Maryland had ratified a revision of the state constitution providing for an increase in the ranks of elected public officials and greater representation. Likewise, because of the increase in population and the growth of the city the need was seen for better city transportation. In July of 1859 the City Passenger Railway was put into operation with the use of the rail horsecar, a means of public transit that spread

rapidly throughout the city.⁶ This innovation came during the mayoralty of Thomas Swann (1856-1860), who was praised a half century later as having "accomplished more for the city's beauty and the citizens' convenience than any city executive before or after him."⁷ It was also during his term in office that the old volunteer fire company was replaced by the municipal department with steam fire engines in place of the outmoded old pumpers. Other notable establishments in or about Baltimore in the 1850's include two state sponsored institutions: the House of Refuge, opened about 1851, to help overcome juvenile delinquency, and, in 1858, the Maryland school for the blind.

The task of education in Maryland in the 1850's was being accomplished by private and church related institutions as well as by the relatively new public school system. Public education grew slowly in Baltimore and in the rest of state. The first public school opened in 1829 and the first public secondary school in 1839. From the beginning, as was true in 1859, the city school system was under the control of the Board of School Commissioners. This body was elected by the city council, with most of the supervisory burden resting on the shoulders of the treasurer of the board until the appointment of the first Superintendent of public instruction in 1866. In 1859 the number of commissioners was 20 and the group of city schools governed by them numbered 82 (38 for boys, 44 for girls).⁸ The slow growth of the public school system is partially attributable to the difficulty faced by the commissioners of getting across the aim of the schools to the populace who looked on them as "poor" schools. It was not until the mid-1860's that a uniform county school system was established.

Institutions of higher education were privately operated with subsidies from the state. What was the University of Maryland in 1859 had been set up by law in 1812. This act of the legislature provided for faculties of medicine, di

vinity, law, and arts and sciences, which were to form the University of Maryland. Initially only the schools of medicine and law became firmly established. Later, in 1839, the college of dentistry was set up, the first institution of its kind in the world and the first to offer the D.D.S. degree.

What is to be said of the political history of Maryland in the late 1850's? There were two outstanding problems, both of which figured in the national scene as well: the question of slavery, and the political corruption consequent upon the rise of the American or Know-Nothing party.

The governor of the state in the years 1858 to 1862 was Thomas Holliday Hicks, the successful Know-Nothing candidate of 1857. As governor, Thomas Hicks has been characterized as one who was unable to see his way clearly to strike out either for or against the secessionist sentiment within his state. Maryland was in a peculiar situation among the states as the struggle over slavery intensified. As McSherry points out in his History of Maryland, the state was in a position of neutrality from a geographical point of view, but through her employment of slavery her relation to the institution was not unlike that of the states to the south. These factors joined to produce an acute division of sympathies among her citizens in the late 1850's.⁹ There are definite indications that the weight of Maryland opinion was with the cause of slavery. In 1859, she contributed extensively to the suppression of the John Brown insurrection and early in 1860 a joint committee in her legislature pledged that "should the hour ever arrive when the Union must be dissolved, Maryland will cast her lot with her sister states of the South and will abide our fortunes to the fullest extent."¹⁰

Pro-slavery sentiment notwithstanding, these were times when some men recognized the evils of slavery but when any method of solution was geared to a fear of the possible results of emancipation. This interpretation can be put on such sentiment as was expressed in 1853 by the legislative committee on the colored

population when it announced "that the two races must ultimately separate, the committee do not doubt. Their separation is the only solution of the political problem to which their present existence together gives rise."¹¹ In 1817 a society had been formed to explore these aims and it was still active. This was the American colonization society which had its subelements in the various states. Active in the Maryland colonization society and president of the national organization in 1859 was John H. B. Latrobe. Merit can be seen in the society in that it actually brought about the freedom of thousands from slavery.

The other gnawing disturbance in Maryland at this time was the Know-Nothing party. The first lodge of Know-Nothings of Baltimore was formed in 1852. At first this was a secret organization which pledged itself to the prevention of frauds at elections, the correction of other abuses, the removal of alien influences, with the restoration of American ideals and ideas. But later investigations of the party's activities found that this pledge also meant opposition to Roman Catholicism and to the growing foreign immigrant population.¹² The party made great gains in 1856, the year in which it attained a majority in the state legislature and elected Thomas Swann to the office of mayor of Baltimore.

Elections in this period were a mockery with the use of striped ballots and intimidation by such groups as the "Plug-uglies", "Rip-raps", and "Tigers", who used terror to keep "foreign" voters from the polls. McSherry tells us that, in 1857, Governor Ligon sent a letter to Mayor Swann asking for the assurance of order in the state elections of that year, threatening to invoke military control. Precautionary measures by the mayor brought outward peace but corruption prevailed.¹³ The Know-Nothings took statewide control in this election by which Thomas Holliday Hicks became governor. The party had now reached the zenith of its power in Maryland.

To turn the tide on political corruption was the aim of the "City Reform

Association" formed in November, 1858. A convention of the association was held on November 17, 1859 called to order by Severn Teackle Wallis, prominent lawyer, scholar and writer. Committees were set up to investigate contested or fraudulent elections, and to draw up laws to do away with the city's political ills. The recommendations of these committees were enacted into law at the General Assembly meeting of January 4, 1860. The election in October, 1860, of the reform candidate for mayor, George William Brown, is considered the breakthrough in the overthrow of Know-Nothing strength in Baltimore, and in the final downfall of the party in the state generally.¹⁴

Finally, with a view to some of the imprints of 1859, whether convention proceedings, sermons, or treatises by clergymen, a brief mention might be made of the various religious sects in Baltimore in the late 1850's and some prominent names connected with them. The denominations included the Roman Catholic, Lutheran, Protestant Episcopal, Methodist Protestant, Methodist Episcopal, Presbyterian, Baptist, and Unitarian. The largest of these was the Roman Catholics, numbering in 1856-57 an estimated 80,814 members with a total of 13 parishes.¹⁵ Francis Patrick Kenrick was named Archbishop of Baltimore in 1851, where he remained through the crucial war years till his death in 1863. He was noted for the theological and biblical scholarship seen in his Bible translations, his Theologia dogmatica, and his Theologia moralis.

News of the Lutheran church in 1858 and 1859 included the establishment of the Evangelical Lutheran Missionary Institute at Selinsgrove, Penna., which was later to become the Susquehanna University.

A prominent name in the Protestant Episcopal church was that of Arthur Cleveland Coxe, a prolific writer on a variety of topics. Coxe was pastor of Grace Church, Baltimore, from 1854 to 1863, when he became assistant bishop and later bishop of the Western New York Episcopal diocese.

Another clergyman, Henry Van Dyke Johns, also of the Protestant Episcopal Church, died on April 22, 1859. He was well known in the city and was serving as rector of Emmanuel Church at the time of his death.

The Methodists in Baltimore in 1859 included the Methodist Episcopal Church and the Methodist Protestant church. The latter started in Baltimore in 1839 when it split away from the Methodist Episcopal church over a controversy concerning the participation of the laity in annual and general conferences.

The death on September 8, 1859 of George Washington Burnap, Unitarian clergyman and writer, marked a lose to the First Independent Church of Baltimore where he had been pastor for 32 years. It is said that more than 25,000 copies of his books were sold during his lifetime. It might be noted that he was one of the founders of the Maryland Historical Society.

This brief historical account of Maryland together with the mention of a few of her leading citizens will serve to give some background in which to consider the printing and publishing within the state as represented by the imprints contained in this study.

C. Printing and Publishing in Maryland in 1859

The first printing press in Maryland was set up in the state capital, Annapolis, in 1726 and it was not until several years beyond the middle of the eighteenth century that printing was introduced into Baltimore.¹ The major printing centers at this time were the larger cities to the north, Philadelphia, New York, and Boston. Reasons for the slow growth of the trade in Baltimore can be seen in the greater dissemination of printing from these cities, as easier transportation became available with the growth of the railroads; and also in the fact that cheaper editions could now be produced by stereotype. Lehmann-Haupt's The Book in America accounts for nineteen establishments engaged in the book trade in Baltimore in 1798 and publishers alone between 1820 and 1852 numbered thirty-two.² An examination of imprints for 1859 gives an unofficial count of 49 businesses or individuals engaged in printing or publishing in the state in 1859. As would be expected the greater number of these businesses was centered in Baltimore, and names of special note were John Murphy and Co.; Kelly, Hedian and Piet; John D. Toy; James Young; Joseph Robinson; McCoull and Slater; John W. Woods; and James Lucas and Son, among others.

The largest of the firms in 1859 was that of John Murphy, whose name was associated with the book trade in Baltimore from 1835. The various addresses of the firm over the years were 44 West Baltimore St., 146 Market St., 178 Baltimore St., and 182 Baltimore St. It was perhaps at 44 West Baltimore St. that John Murphy opened his first printing and stationery shop in 1835. In 1837 he expanded his business to include publishing.³ Father Schlegel's unpublished thesis on the Murphy Printing and Publishing House shows that in a 40 year period (1836-1876)

there were a total of 1458 editions or printings of works published.⁴ The present study accounts for 57 of these works in 1859. Both M. J. Kelly and John B. Piet of the later Kelly, Hedian and Piet firm were partners with Murphy in the early 1850's. The Murphy company came to be known as the Metropolitan Press and at the height of its growth occupied the five story Marble Building at 182 Baltimore Street, the address appearing in publications of 1859. The name "Metropolitan" is reflected in two of Murphy's publications, the Metropolitan, a monthly magazine published from 1853 to 1859, and the Metropolitan Catholic Almanac and Laity's Directory, which Murphy published for only three years starting with the 1859 issue "at the instance of the late Provincial Council of Baltimore", as the almanac states.

John Murphy specialized in the publication and sale of Catholic materials from theological treatises (the Theologica dogmatica of Francis Patrick Kenrick), Bibles, hagiography, apologetical works, to devotional literature, as the works of Father Frederick William Faber, religious novels and hymnals. These publications were a great help toward the religious instruction of an increasing Catholic immigrant population. Many of the works were translations of foreign Catholic publications.

The company also took part in publishing editions of the various textbooks of the day including the Irving series of catechisms in the various disciplines edited by Martin Kerney, as well as Kerney's works in arithmetic. Murphy also did commercial publishing for societies and railroads, and issued some government publications and speeches of prominent men of that time, such as John Breckinridge, Reverdy Johnson, and Anthony Kennedy.

Another large publishing and printing house in Baltimore was the firm mentioned above, Kelly, Hedian and Piet, who were also concerned principally with

Catholic materials. John B. Piet, a partner of Murphy from 1850 to 1858, joined M. J. Kelly and P. J. Hedian in 1859 to set up a new business at 174 West Baltimore Street.⁵ An advertisement in the 1850 issue of Dunigan's American Catholic Almanac indicates that the firm had recently completed improvements on their building which was filled with every convenience to meet the demand of their business, which seems to have been well established at this time. Items advertised, besides religious articles, pious engravings, etc., include school books for the Baltimore public schools, school supplies, miscellaneous books in the various departments of literature and science.

Kelly, Hedian and Piet also published Catholic works in translation from foreign titles; novels, such as the Lion of Flanders, the Spaewife, and Blanche, a Tale from the French; the Bible translations of Francis Patrick Kenrick; and theological and devotional works. Some titles published by Murphy are found as well with the Kelly, Hedian and Piet imprint. For a time the firm was the publisher of the Catholic Mirror, a leading Catholic newspaper and official organ of the Archbishop of Baltimore and his suffragans.

Another prominent name in the printing trade in 1859 was James Lucas and Son, whose printing establishment was located at the corner of Calvert Street and Lovely Lane. Imprints of 1859 indicate that they engaged in printing reports of various institutions, commercial and private, as well as some sermons and treatises.

Joseph Robinson, another printer, who was located at No. 11 South Street, issued in 1859 the proceedings of the Masonic orders, school catalogs, and the works of Arthur Cleveland Coxe.

The firm of McCoull and Slater published the majority of municipal documents in 1859, such as the proceedings of the city council, messages of the mayor, city ordinances, and reports of various divisions of the city government. Their business was located at the northwest corner of Baltimore and Charles Streets.

Cushings and Bailey were located in a five story building at 262 Baltimore Street in 1858 when Gobright selected their establishment to represent the book trade in Baltimore in his city directory "because we are satisfied that it is more extensive in its operations, and more general in the assortment and extent of its stock than any other south of Philadelphia."⁶ In 1889 they were advertising school books; books in law, medicine, science, agriculture, and theology; Bibles; hymnals for all denominations; children's books; and stationery for all types of business.⁷

James Young, steam book and job printer, was located at 112 or 114 West Baltimore Street. His establishment dated back to 1836. He was an energetic business man who took a leading part in political affairs. He served for six years as president of the First Branch of the City Council, and at one time was acting mayor.⁸

The printing shop of John D. Toy was located at the corner of Market and St. Paul Streets. In 1859 he issued some seventeen works including materials for the Unitarian Church, for the University of Maryland, and treatises on the negro question.

Other prominent men in the book trade in 1859 include the following list of names with their addresses. The brevity of mention arises from lack of information concerning these men and not from any judgment on their significance.

T. Newton Kurtz - 151 West Pratt Street.

George Willig, Jr. - 1 North Charles Street - specialized in the publication of music.

James S. Waters - 224 West Baltimore Street.

Sherwood and Co. - at the northwest corner of Baltimore and Gay Streets.

J. B. Rose and Co. - 77 West Baltimore Street.

Samuel S. Mills - the Jarvis Building, 1 North Street.

William M. Innes - Adams Express Building

Frederick A. Hanzsche - 166 Baltimore Street, or 212 Baltimore Street near Charles.

John W. Woods.
