## INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this dissertation is to present a record of Maryland printing from 1815 to 1818 inclusive. It is, then, part of a research project of the "American Imprints Inventory" to compile a complete national bibliography.

The American Imprints Inventory has accumulated much of the material which has been produced by the presses of the nation. From this vast reservoir of material, the check-list in these pages has been drawn.

This check-list of Maryland Imprints contains all the titles and locations found in the National Union Catalogue of the Library of Congress, the card catalogues of the Enoch Pratt Free Library, the Maryland Historical Society, and titles that had to be located in other libraries throughout the country.

A sketch of the social and political situation leading up to the period, 1815 to 1818, and the period itself will be given in the subsequent pages. After this will come an account of the more prominent printers and publishers of this period.

The imprints are arranged chronologically with the entries set up by author and title. As for the entry and capitalization form, the Library of Congress rules will be followed. Notations, in symbol form, of the libraries and sources in which these imprints can be located will be found under the imprints.

The key to the location of these libraries will precede the imprints. The manual in which this key is contained is Symbols Used in the Union Catalog of the Library of Congress, Fourth edition, 1942.

## CHAPTER I

### HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF THE PERIOD

The first part of this chapter is devoted to a general survey of the history of the  
country from the beginning of the century to the present time. It is intended to  
show the general course of events, and to point out the principal causes and  
effects of the various revolutions and changes which have taken place. It is  
not intended to give a detailed account of any one particular event, or to  
discuss the merits and demerits of any one particular policy or measure.

Of all the periods through which Maryland has passed, perhaps the most trying was the second decade of the nineteenth century. We are particularly interested in the three years, 1815-1818, but it would not be amiss to consider here the events that immediately preceded them - especially the circumstances surrounding the War of 1812 and its effects, which fashioned the social and political trends of the years to come.

The Revolution of 1776, quite understandably, did not leave Great Britain and the infant American republic on very friendly terms. The fires of mutual hostility between them seemed unwilling to die out. So it was at the turn of the century. So it was four years later when Thomas Jefferson found himself elected to the Presidency for a second term.<sup>1</sup>

He found it necessary, in fact, to address the Ninth Congress and discuss with it the unfavorable turn our foreign relations had taken.<sup>2</sup> Britain was again and again making inroads on our sovereignty. All along our East Coast she was acting piratically, seizing our ships and impressing our citizens into His Majesty's services.

Soon state after state was sending memorials to Congress demanding action. Finally, in April, 1806, an act was passed forbidding trade with British home and colonial ports.<sup>3</sup> Britain was not particularly impressed but she did retaliate.

Slightly over one year later - June, 1807, an American frigate, the Chesapeake, was attacked by the British frigate, Melampus off Annapolis. Taken by surprise the Chesapeake was compelled to strike her flag, but only after three men had been killed and eighteen wounded.<sup>4</sup>

Throughout the land clamor for action was raised. At Annapolis, at Baltimore, all over, citizens pledged their "lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor" in support of any Government measures to avenge this British taunt.

On December of 1808, the Embargo Act was passed. American vessels were forbidden to sail to foreign ports; all foreign vessels, to take out cargoes.<sup>5</sup> New England, understandably, demurred. The South, though, sustained the administration, New England won out and effected the repeal of the Act on March 1, 1809, replacing it with the Nonintercourse Act, which opened American commerce to all nations except England and France.<sup>6</sup>

Despite this turbulent state of affairs President Jefferson, whose two terms had expired, refused to run for a third term. James Madison, a fellow Democrat, was elected in his stead.

In Maryland, Edward Lloyd was chosen Governor on June 5, 1809, to fill the unexpired term of Governor Wright, who had resigned, probably for political reasons. In October of the following year Robert Bowie was elected. All three men were Democrats.<sup>7</sup>

Much criticism had been waged against the frequent policy changes of Jefferson. Now Madison shared it. Such criticism, of course, made international relations all the more difficult, especially since the Democratic Party was strongly clamoring for open conflict. This put Madison in a difficult position. Could he save the Union from war and control the party too? On June 18, 1812, the answer came when the U.S. formally declared war against Great Britain. The draft of declaration, incidentally, was prepared by Attorney General William Pinkney of Maryland.<sup>8</sup>

Like the national administration, Maryland, too, was Democratic. But the Democratic influence in Maryland was soon to wane. On June 20, 1812, there appeared in the Federal Republican, a Federalist newspaper published in Baltimore by Alexander C. Hanson and Jacob Wagner, an editorial following up previous attacks on the administration. Hanson and Wagner were Federalists of the most extreme type. Following the appearance of this critical editorial, a "patriotic" mob wrecked the printing office, razing the building in which the paper

was published.

The editors, unwilling to give up their opposition, continued to publish and print their paper in Georgetown until July 26. Then Hanson returned to Baltimore to occupy a place on Charles Street. The paper, printed in Georgetown, was distributed from the Charles Street office.

Again the citizens of Baltimore became incensed. They rose up and gutted Hanson's establishment a second time. This time Hanson and some of his followers were imprisoned until the jail was stormed. Eight of the Prisoners were able to mingle with the attackers, but nine were beaten, one even tarred and feathered.<sup>9</sup>

As Governor Bowie failed to apprehend the leaders of the mob, the Federalists accused him of shielding criminals. This incident and disagreement between the counties and Baltimore City -- about the influence which the latter should wield in state affairs -- helped to bring Maryland as a whole into the camp of the Federalists. In the fall gubernatorial election of 1812 the Democratic complexion of Maryland changed, and Levin Winder, a Federalist, was elected governor.<sup>10</sup>

But back to the War. Two newspapers active at this time and the period to follow were the Gazette and the Niles' Register. At the commencement of the war, Niles in his famous Register states that "Maryland had not many fast-sailing clippers. What few ships and brigs she had she dispatched to sea in search of British merchant men."<sup>11</sup> These Maryland ships proved invaluable to our fighting forces, for in the entire U. S. at that time there were only seven frigates and a few smaller vessels.

Fortune shone on us for quite a while. Despite a meagre sea force, America's principal harbors and ports were protected successfully. Of course, as Great Britain was busily engaged in her war with France, she could give but little attention to the conflict in the U.S. Early in 1813, though, the

the British fleet moved up the Chesapeake Bay, threatening Annapolis and Baltimore. They attacked, in fact, several towns on the Eastern Shore of the Bay.<sup>12</sup>

General Winder, who had been re-elected during this critical period, did his utmost for the protection of his state. With his small army he tried vainly to stave off an attack on Washington. At Bladensburg, the forces of Winder, along with those of General St. Ansbury, met with disaster. Washington was captured and burned.

Baltimore was now the goal of the British forces. Fortifications of all kinds were thrown up to support the defenders of Fort McHenry, the principal hope of the city, and on Hampstead Hill, to guard against the expected advance on North Point.<sup>13</sup> Unmolested, the main British Army landed off North Point at the mouth of the Patapsco on September 12th. They had not marched far when an American sniper mortally wounded Ross, the British General, as he rose to survey the field.<sup>14</sup>

By firing and hiding, then retiring, the Americans employed to good effect the unconventional military tactics introduced by Jackson at New Orleans. Furthermore, the use of breastworks and sure rifle fire, as against the British style of aimless firing followed by bayonet charges, proved too much for the surprised enemy. Demoralized and beaten after a day's battle, the British army retreated.

After this battle the threat of future British assaults by the sea was brought to an end with the cessation of the bombardment of Fort McHenry on September 14, 1814. Their operations on Baltimore a failure, the enemy withdrew. Peace came with the signing of a treaty at Ghent, Belgium, on December 24, 1814, a treaty that was ratified on April 10, 1815.<sup>15</sup>

The war proved advantageous to the U. S. as a whole. It had shown the world - and Americans themselves - that the new republic cherished its

independence much more than it did commercial gain or, for that matter, peace. It showed that the United States of America was here to stay.

Maryland, of course, gained immensely in prestige from Baltimore's gallant fight. It soon began to assume a respectable position in the domestic manufacturing field, too. Its exports increased by leaps and bounds, so that by 1815 it could boast an export trade of \$5,036,601 and, by 1816, of \$7,338,767 - during the war it had amounted to but \$248,434.<sup>16</sup> Three projects that were to lend to the expansion of inland trade, too, began to take form: the Cumberland Road, the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, and the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad.

Maryland politics after the war were in a state of flux. In 1815 Charles Carnan Ridgely was elected Governor for three one-year terms. The administration of Ridgely and that of his successor, Governor Charles Goldsborough (1818-1819) saw the passage of a series of acts of a humanitarian character: to provide for the education of poor children, for example. Restrictions were put on lotteries, too, and funds were appropriated for freed Negroes and for ameliorating conditions affecting Negroes, still slaves.<sup>17</sup>

With Goldsborough's last term the Federalist Party practically disappeared. By virtue of the county voting system, rather than by the will of the people, the Federalists remained in control. Under the existing Constitution the delegates were the representatives of the state counties, and not of the people. One man, therefore, had as much political power in some of these counties as ten men in others. At this time twelve Maryland counties were Federalist. In direct taxes the population of these counties, 131,000, had been paying \$68,000. There were only seven Democratic counties, whose population of 140,000 had been paying in direct taxes \$83,000.<sup>18</sup>

These conditions created an increasing demand that the Governor of Maryland should be elected by popular vote rather than by the General Assembly.

It was the administration of Charles Goldsborough that was responsible for the first concerted demand from the Democrats that the Governor be chosen by direct popular vote. A bill was submitted to the legislature to increase the representation of Baltimore in the House of Delegates from two to four members. The Federalists, of course, opposed such a bill. They opposed also the granting of franchise to the Jews, a privilege which had been denied to them since the Toleration Act of 1649. Finally, in the autumn of 1819, the Federalist party was ousted.<sup>19</sup>

At this time all efforts to give equality of suffrage to the Jews, most of whom lived in Baltimore, seemed to be making little progress. Such was the case until 1816, when Thomas Kennedy of Washington County took up the problem. His labors did not cease until his measures had been incorporated in the laws of Maryland. The fruits of his undertaking freed the Jews of civil disabilities, for in 1826 Jews could hold any office in the government of the state.<sup>20</sup>

Now that we have examined some of the political and social trends in Maryland during 1815-1818, and the factors that fashioned these trends, we can better appreciate the setting in which the printing of this period was done. In the next chapter, therefore, we consider the printing of this period by viewing some of the more prominent printers and publishers of the day.



Printing as a trade had quite an early start in Maryland. Lawrence C. Wroth estimates that only Massachusetts and Pennsylvania can boast of earlier presses.<sup>1</sup> True, Virginia, too, saw a press initiated at Jamestown somewhat before Maryland's first one, but its lack of permanence renders it unworthy of any particular attention. St. Mary's City, it appears, was the original seat of printing in Maryland - understandably, too, because St. Mary's City was Maryland's first capital. From there it moved with the government to Annapolis; finally, Baltimore became Maryland's chief printing center.

McMurtrie and the above-cited Wroth give quite a thorough treatment of early printing in their indispensable volumes - History of Printing in the United States and A History of Printing in Colonial Maryland, respectively. But these works, along with A. Rachel Minick's A History of Printing in Maryland 1791-1800, go no further in their research than 1800. Relatively little has been done on the history of printing in the first few decades of the nineteenth century, the period in which we are especially interested. We know that after the War of 1812 printing boomed in Maryland. The startling increase in the numbers of printers and publishers bears witness to this. Of these tradesmen only a few reached positions of prominence in their respective communities.

If it were our purpose to present a detailed study of Maryland printing in these first few decades of the nineteenth century, then it would be imperative that we treat somewhat fully of each printer and publisher, whatever his significance or insignificance. But such is not our direct aim. We intend to give but a background-survey. It best serves our objective, then, to single out the more outstanding printers and publishers of this period. The following men fit into this category: Jonas Green, of Annapolis; Hezekiah Niles and Fielding Lucas, Jr., both of Baltimore; John Gruber and Schaeffer & Maund, both of Hagerstown. From our treatment of these men we shall have quite a good picture of printing from 1815-1818.

JONAS GREEN.

Jonas Green was the last in a long line of printers. His family had been in the trade well over one hundred and fifty years. The background of this family has been so well covered by Lawrence C. Wroth's A History of Printing in Colonial Maryland that only a few remarks about the family will be made here.

Ever since 1738 the Green family had been printing in Annapolis. Jonas's great grandfather, Samuel Green, started the press there. It was not until 1811 that Jonas Green took over the family printing establishment. From this time on to 1839 he did quite an effective job, printing the laws of the State and the Maryland Gazette. Green's passing away saw the center of the printing trade shift from Annapolis to the younger city of Baltimore. It will be remembered that Baltimore had by this time, the end of the War of 1812, become the chief city of Maryland.<sup>2</sup>

HEZEKIAH NILES.

In Baltimore during this period Hezekiah Niles' press was flourishing. The second son of another Hezekiah Niles and his wife, Mary, Hezekiah was born at Jeffries Ford, East Bradford Township, Chester, Pennsylvania, on October 10, 1777. At seventeen he took his printing apprenticeship under Benjamin Johnson, a printer in Philadelphia. In Wilmington, Delaware, in 1797, he set up his own printing establishment. 1799, though, saw him form a partnership with Vincent Bonsal for bookselling and job printing, Niles being the junior partner. A branch office was set up at the time in Baltimore.

During this partnership with Bonsal, Niles was quite active in politics. The partnership was dissolved in 1804. The following year, Niles assumed the editor's position of the Evening Post, a Democratic-Republican newspaper.<sup>3</sup>

Niles' outstanding contribution to American journalism, Niles' Weekly Register, was begun in 1811 and continued until 1849 - upon its publication

Niles' fame rests.<sup>4</sup> Referred to as an authority in the courts of justice and in legislative assemblies of the time, the Register today may be said to constitute one of the truest accounts of the history of our country for the period over which it extends. After the War of 1812 this paper greatly aided and encouraged the internal improvement plans of our country. As for politics, it was completely Democratic.

FIELDING LUCAS, JR.

In Baltimore another publisher of importance was Fielding Lucas, Jr. He was born in Virginia on September 3, 1781. At the age of fourteen he went to Philadelphia, where he secured employment as a printer's apprentice. Here, too, he met his future wife, Elizabeth Mary Carrell, whom he married on May 15, 1810.<sup>5</sup>

Around 1804 he came to Baltimore, engaging himself in a stationer and bookseller's shop. After 1810 he joined the firm of Conrad, Lucas and Company, Booksellers, Stationers, and Paper Manufacturers. One year later Lucas became head of the business, upon Conrad's withdrawal.

Lucas' firm not only boosted secular works but also made Baltimore a Catholic center of publishing. In 1816 Lucas issued his first Catholic work, the fourth edition of A New and Easy System of Geography for the Use of the Students of Saint Mary's College, Baltimore, by John O'Neil.<sup>6</sup>

Active in public affairs, Fielding Lucas was connected with many civic and industrial enterprises. In 1810 we find his name among those who planned the Washington Monument. The War of 1812 saw him a private in the 27th Baltimore Infantry; still later he served on the committee that erected the Battle Monument.<sup>7</sup> In 1838 Lucas became President of the City Council and Director of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad. He also aided in the formation of the Maryland Historical Society.<sup>8</sup> He had many literary friends: William Gwynn, the editor of the

Federal Gazette; Edward Coote Pinkney, the poet; John H. Payne, the playwright and composer; and John H. B. Latrobe, painter and artist - all these men were members of the renowned literary Delphian Club.

When past seventy years of age, Fielding Lucas, Jr. retired from his extensive business. Though not a Catholic he probably was the most prolific Catholic publisher of this period - 1815-1818. He died March 12, 1854.<sup>9</sup>

#### JOHN GRUBER.

As Hagerstown, Maryland, was settled chiefly by German immigrants, it is not surprising to find that German printing was done on a large scale. Among German printers of this period, John Gruber, the first German printer of Hagerstown, stands out. Born in October, 1768, he grew gradually to prefer the printing trade to the medical profession his father wanted him to pursue. On two scores Gruber became famous: the publication of the second Almanac in the United States - The Hagers-Town Town and Country Almanack, and his Der Neue Nord-Americanische Stadt und Land Calender, both of which were destined to last for well over a century.<sup>10</sup>

He was in business by himself until 1811. At this time he made Daniel May, his son-in-law, a partner. Gruber and May appear frequently on the imprints of 1815-1818. In December of 1857 Gruber died, a full eighty-five years old. Never an extremist in politics, he was a man who tended to his own affairs with diligence, known always as a gentleman, securing respect everywhere.

#### SCHAEFFER & MAUND.

Engaged in German printing, too, were Messrs. Schaeffer and Maund, printers and publishers of high standing in Baltimore. These men were interested in supplying German books in every field to the German population of Maryland.<sup>11</sup> The interest in the importation of German books was again stressed in their Almanac for 1818, when they stated that German books in every field were regular

imported from Germany. Of their successes, the Gemeinschaftliche Gesangbuch was by far their best.<sup>15</sup> Published in 1817, this joint hymnbook was promoted with care for Lutheran congregations. So popular did it become that it was printed three times within two years.

The publishing of German books, in general, brought only meagre financial returns, barely sufficient to make ends meet. Most publishers in this field drew their main sources of income from job printing, in English and German.

Thus we bring to a close our brief discussion of Maryland printing. Now we pass on to an examination of the material that came off the presses of Maryland during 1815-1818.

Much diligence was used in the compilation of this work. The many titles contained herein have been verified either by looking at the books themselves or by correspondence. Though there are five hundred and seventeen titles listed, there is still the possibility that obscure imprints will one day be found. Therefore, this work can by no means be considered as definitive. However, it can be looked upon as an honest effort to bring together and verify the on-hand imprints for the years 1815-1818, inclusive.

As we look back over this work, it is of interest to notice that the presses of Baltimore printed more material than those of the other cities and towns in the State taken together. Of interest, too, is the fact that in the year 1818 more printing was done than in any one of the foregoing years of our period, 1815-1818.
