This study of printing in Maryland in the years 1841
and 1842 is part of a research project initiated by the Ameri-
can Imprints Inventory which was established for the purpose
of preparing a complete national bibliography of every known
American imprint issued before 1876. A complete national
bibliography of the records of the civilization and culture of
early America will preserve rare and valuable written material.
Through the use of microfilms the contents of these materials
can be made accessible to historians and other scholars through-
out the world.

In this particular work, it is my purpose to present
a complete record of all printing in Maryland in 1841 and 1842.
Although most of the data were first gathered by the WPA
Writers' Project Workers, the task of organizing, analyzing,
verifying, and editing has been divided by states into manageable
time periods, on which various researchers have worked. The
existence of all items in this check list has been verified and
each entry has been concluded with a list of libraries which
report having the item. References are also made to the major
bibliographies in which any item is listed.

The WPA Writers' Project Workers recorded their findings
of information regarding all known printed items over one hundred
years old on 3 x 5 slips. These slips, sorted only as to state
and year, were stored under the protection of the National Union

Catalog at the Library of Congress. In this study an attempt has been made to identify and verify each entry with all possible preciseness, by search in the National Union Catalog, in the Library of Congress Catalog, in bibliographies, by examinations of the imprints themselves and by correspondence with holding libraries. Although it is not possible to claim complete success, every effort has been made to make this a valuable and reliable source of information regarding the existence, description, and location of Maryland imprints. A key to the symbols used to locate the titles listed is provided at the beginning of the check list. It is the same as that in use in the National Union Catalog.

The imprints in this study reveal that the problems and interests of the people of Maryland were national as well as local. To show the relationship between the publishing output and the conditions that produced it, a brief historical background of the nation and of the state is presented in Chapters I and II. In Chapter III, a brief consideration is given also to the printers and publishers responsible for the dissemination of the ideas contained in this written record of the state.

The check list itself comprises the main portion of the work. The arrangement is alphabetical by author or by title where there is no author. American Library Association and Library of Congress rules for choice of entry, form of entry, and description of each item have been followed.

Periodicals and newspapers are also included in a separate alphabetical list.

To facilitate interpretation and use of the check list, there are appended a list of the printed output, individual printers and publishers, a list of the types of materials published, and an author-title-subject index.

I wish to acknowledge my gratitude to the staff of the National Union Catalog and especially to Miss M. Gardiner, whose advice and cooperation have made a laborious task pleasant and satisfying.

THE UNITED STATES IN THE 1840'S

The United States in the 1840's was recovering from its first severe depression, which had begun with the Panic of 1837. Despite these difficult years, ending about 1844, industrial and agricultural progress continued in most sections of the country. New sections were formed as new geographical provinces were occupied and regional geography played a significant role in the economic, political, and social life of the country.

The events leading to the financial panic of 1837, though not without political maneuvering centering around Andrew Jackson's veto of the renewal of the Charter of the Second Bank of the United States, were overspeculation in land, canals, and railroads. In the administration of Jackson's successor, Martin Van Buren, elected in 1836, Congress finally made the national government independent of the privately owned banking system of the country by the passage in 1840 of the Independent Treasury Act, which provided that government funds were thereafter to be deposited not in privately owned banks but in government sub-treasuries created in important cities.¹ The Act was repealed in 1841, but a new act with essentially the same provisions was passed in 1846.

The financial panic in 1837 and the ensuing business

depression that lasted through Van Buren's administration, so discredited the Democrats that in 1840 the Whigs elected their candidate, William Henry Harrison. Harrison died, however, a few weeks after he was inaugurated in 1841, and the Vice-President, John Tyler, became President. The chief aims of the Whig Party, led by Clay were to restore the Bank of the United States and to promote a high tariff. Tyler, however, had joined the Whigs, not because of his belief in their political principles, but because of his enmity toward Jackson. After Congress, in 1841, passed a bill to recharter the Bank, Tyler vetoed it, whereupon he was read out of the Whig Party.²

By this time, however, the issues such as the tariff and the Bank, which had been the cause of sectional controversy for two decades, had been superseded by a far more fundamental sectional issue, that of Negro slavery. The problem had already caused sharp controversy since the foundation of the nation, and from 1840 to 1865 was destined to dominate all phases of American life.

The struggle between the three sections of the country (West, South, and Northeast), each of which had developed different types of economic and social life and political ideas, for national legislation and domestic policy that would promote their individual welfare, was continued during this period.³

Life in much of the West, i.e., the regions lying west of the Alleghenies, was still laborious and dangerous. The effort to establish farms and homes on uncleared land, to repel hostile Indians, to form communities, local governments, and

finally States, engendered the qualities of courage, self-reliance, initiative and endurance. A democratic spirit prevailed; each man considered himself the equal of his fellows and entitled to the same rights. Belief was strong in the ability of the people to govern themselves and in a strong state government as opposed to a powerful federal government.

The economy and social life of the South, also an agricultural region differed considerably from that of the West. The South was devoted to the growing of one principal crop, cotton, on large plantations with Negro slave labor. The interests of the West and the South were similar in the early period of the sectional conflict, but as time went on, the conflict between North and South on the issue of slavery and the preservation of the union overshadowed every other sectional conflict; and in this fundamental difference the various Western States took the side of the section, North or South, in which they were located.

The economic life of the Northeast, comprising the New England States, New York, New Jersey and Eastern Pennsylvania, was stimulated by the new inventions and processes of the Industrial Revolution. This region was becoming a great manufacturing center. Home industries employing manual power gave way to factories using machinery driven first by water power and then by steam power. The large cities, Boston, New York, Philadelphia and Baltimore began to grow at an unprecedented rate. An important factor in their growth was the improved means of communication developing at the same time between West and East, giving to the great trading centers easier access to

the products of the West. These new means of communication, canals and railroads, took the place of the crude roads which had been almost the only means of East-West travel in the first quarter of the 19th century.

In the North after 1820, sentiment, based chiefly on ethical grounds, grew for the abolition of slavery, either gradually and with compensation for the slaveowner, or immediately and unconditionally. The South, feeling that the very basis of its economic and social order was threatened, passed stringent laws to keep its slaves under control. The division of opinion in the nation on the slavery issue grew more violent in the fourth decade of the century as the struggle began between North and South over the question of whether or not slavery should be permitted in the newly added regions -- Texas, Oregon, California and Mexico.

The Presidential campaign of 1844, won by James K. Polk, was fought largely on the issue of the annexation of Texas and Oregon.⁴ The annexation of Texas in March, 1845, brought about a dispute between Mexico and the United States, which culminated in the Mexican War, successfully concluded by the United States in 1848.

The discussion over the slavery issue became so acrimonious that in the Presidential election of 1848 the two principal political parties avoided committing themselves on the issue. In that election, the Whig candidate, General Zachary Taylor, a Southerner who had never urged the extension of slavery, won over the Democratic candidate, Lewis Cass, who

advocated permitting each territory when it applied for statehood to determine for itself whether or not it wished to be slave or free. In the year following the election, the slavery and anti-slavery groups in Congress proved to be so evenly divided that no solution to the problem of slavery in the newly acquired regions could be reached. At this juncture, Henry Clay, in January, 1850, introduced a bill, the so-called "Omnibus Bill," which proposed a series of compromises between the demands of the two groups.

Despite the difficulties arising from the financial crisis of 1837 and the slavery controversy, the last half of the fourth decade was marked by great commercial prosperity in the United States. This was caused principally by the discovery of gold in California; the growth in wheat production through the extension of wheat-planting in Iowa, Wisconsin and Minnesota; the increased production of cotton in the South and of manufactured goods in the North; and the rapid growth of railroads, which served to connect the northern Mississippi basin and the Eastern States.⁵

Although the United States was throughout the decade a young nation culturally, there was distinguished literary activity in the New England States. Among the poets of this period were William Cullen Bryant, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, Edgar Allan Poe, James Russell Lowell, and Walt Whitman; novelists were Nathaniel Hawthorne, Herman Melville, and William Gilmore Simms; historians were George Bancroft, William H. Prescott, John Lothrop Motley, and Francis Parkman; essayists

were Ralph Waldo Emerson, Oliver Wendell Holmes and Henry David Thoreau.

CHAPTER II

MARYLAND IN THE 1840'S

In the decade from 1840 to 1850, Maryland, like the rest of the nation, was swiftly changing from predominantly agricultural pursuits to industrial activity. The refinement of the industrial system, including the chartered joint-stock corporation, flotation of securities in the investment market, and the extension of manufacturing into fields which had been hitherto dominated by foreign industry, continued apace. Earlier Maryland had taken a lead in pioneer transportation and communication. The Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, one of the first railroads in the nation, was projected at Baltimore in 1827. In 1844, the first telegraph line in the United States was constructed between Baltimore and Washington. These innovations and other internal improvements, however, had not come without a financial burden, whose rectification consumed most of the decade between 1840 and 1850.

From 1820 to 1836, Maryland, in her enthusiasm over internal improvements in transportation and communications -- railroads and canals -- incurred an indebtedness of approximately \$15,000,000.¹ The state's financial crisis deepened with the collapse of the Bank of Maryland in 1835, following the failure of the Bank of the United States to obtain a new charter.

Maryland banks suspended specie payment in 1837 and depreciation of the currency followed. Attempts by the state to meet the interest through revenues from heavy taxes met with considerable opposition from the populace. Anti-tax associations were formed to resist the collection and in 1842 Maryland defaulted on interest payments.²

By the middle of the 1840's new revenue measures were passed under the recommendation of the new governor, Thomas G. Pratt, which met the approval of the populace. About the same time, the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company's financial condition was strengthened by an arrangement with the railroad company for the transportation of the coal trade, and by a state bond issue. Hence, with funds now available, the canal could be completed to Cumberland. The end of the 1840's saw a re-establishment of financial security in Maryland. -- as evidenced by the following summary published in 1845 of the cost of the Internal Improvement System in Maryland:

The Chesapeake and Ohio Canal is 184 miles long, cost the sum of \$12,370,470, and has even in its present unfinished state an average income of some 50 or \$60,000.

The Tide Water Canal is 45 miles long and cost \$2,900,000.

The Port Deposit Canal is 10 miles long and cost \$200,000.

The Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road is 188 miles long and cost some 6 or \$7,000,000. Its income in 1844 was \$658,620 and its net profit \$346,946.

The Baltimore and Washington Rail Road is 38 miles long and cost \$3,000,000 and its income in 1844 was \$212,129 of which \$101,529 was net.

The Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road is 58 miles long and cost \$7,623,600.

The Annapolis and Elk Ridge Rail Road is 20½ miles in length and cost \$414,435,60. [sic/3]

Thus, with the facilities for transportation growing by

leaps and bounds, a larger and better market was provided for agricultural products in the western Maryland counties.

Despite the financial difficulties, by 1840, Maryland, with Baltimore as its metropolis, had become a commercial and industrial as well as an agricultural state. Favorable geographical situation and trade connections were the chief commercial advantages for Baltimore. Ships from her harbors engaged in a prosperous foreign trade, reaching ports in South America, the West Indies, Europe and Asia. Her ships also engaged in a profitable domestic coastal trade, bringing in grain and cotton for her textile and milling industries. The iron industry, though in its infancy, was greatly stimulated by the construction of railroads, and the development of the steam engine as a source of power created demands for the coal of the Appalachian region.

Maryland's industrial development during the forties was not without paralleled changes in her agriculture. From colonial days much attention had been given to the cultivation of the soil. Tobacco and corn, which formed the staple agricultural products for many years, had been raised alternately without a replenishing of the soil's fertility. Consequently, the richest lands had become impoverished and those of less fertility had become unproductive. The new markets for food crops, resulting from the increase in the urban population, along with the improvement of transportation, stimulated needed changes in agriculture. Agricultural societies were formed throughout the counties; a state agricultural association was

organized; and a journal was published advocating the cause of improved agriculture. Many farmers responded by turning their attention to the restoration of the barren wastes by the judicious use of lime, guano, and compost to restore the original fertility.⁴

The rapid growth of population in the northeast sections, especially in the city of Baltimore, brought into prominence the inequities of the system of representation which did not take population into account. Such a system naturally placed the government into the hands of a decreasing minority, represented by the tobacco raising and slave-holding counties of Southern Maryland, with respect to the attitude of the majority toward slavery prevented any changes until 1837. At this time, the opposition, awakened by the enthusiasm over internal improvements, effected the adoption of amendments which provided for the election of the governor and senators by direct vote of the people, a slight increase in the representation of the city of Baltimore and the larger counties, and slight decrease in that of smaller counties. Along with this change, most of the more important offices, formerly filled by appointment by the governor, become subject to popular election.

In the decade of the forties, Maryland had four governors, beginning with the first popularly elected governor of Maryland, William Grayson, Democrat, serving from 1838 to 1841. He was followed by Francis Thomas, 1841 to 1844, also a Democrat; Thomas G. Pratt, 1844 to 1847, a Whig; and Philip Francis Thomas, 1847 to 1850, a Democrat.

Popular interest in political affairs extended to national as well as to local affairs. For 30 years, beginning in 1832, with the nomination for the Presidency of William Wirt from Baltimore by the anti-Masonic party, Baltimore was the place at which many national political conventions were held. One of the more exciting of these conventions was the Democratic National Convention which met in Baltimore on May 5, 1840. The excitement of the following presidential campaign was felt throughout the state. The election in Maryland was attended by so much excitement and commotion that "business appeared to be paralyzed, more important commercial transactions were suspended until after the contest, public institutions, hotels and places of amusement were neglected, and even the sanctity of the domestic hearth was invaded by party rancor."⁵

With regard to the fundamental sectional issue, Maryland was a slaveholding state. By 1840, slavery had become unprofitable in Maryland, except in the eastern and southern counties where the staple crop economy remained based on slave labor. Even here, the impoverished condition of the soil, resulting from continuous cultivation of tobacco without regard to the preservation of its fertility, the profitableness of slavery was fast becoming a questionable proposition. Thus, the anti-slavery sentiment in this period was derived largely from economic rather than humanitarian motives. Many in the minority who supported gradual emancipation felt that emancipation and colonization should go together.

Although the people of Maryland received much of their

cultural reading fare from the national centers such as New York, Philadelphia and Boston during this period, the production of sheet music in Baltimore was indicative of local interest in cultural development. The Baltimore Sun was the first newspaper to use the telegraph, and its system was so efficient that government officials read news of the Mexican War in the Sun as much as twenty-four hours before they obtained the same news through government channels.⁶

Because of the scarcity of public funds in this period, progress in the movement for state supported free public education was slow and uneven. Some counties, however, had a partial school system and a large number of private schools and colleges flourished. By the census of 1840, the state had 12 universities and colleges, 127 academies and grammar schools; and 567 primary schools. Baltimore had the distinction of having the first dental school in the United States when the Baltimore College of Dental Surgery was founded in 1840.

In matters of religion, the history of Maryland reveals her as a pioneer, with a host of religious dignitaries. By 1840, there were a large number of religious bodies in Maryland, with the Catholic membership exceeding that of any other major denomination -- Methodists, Baptists, Presbyterians, Friends, and Episcopalians. The religious leaders of this period often resorted to the printed page in their attempt to inform their followers and others in matters of religion.

This brief historical background of Maryland in the

1840's reveals the relationship between the published output of the state and the times that produced them. The imprints of this study reveal the concern with local and national political issues; with social changes; and with the cultural advancement of the state.

CHAPTER III
PRINTING IN MARYLAND IN THE 1840'S

After the middle of the eighteenth century, the chief center of life in Maryland became the relatively new city of Baltimore. In the field of printing the new city was no less distinguished than in other segments of its industrial development. From the 19 persons and firms engaged as printers, publishers, and booksellers in Baltimore in 1798, the number rose to 32 between 1820 and 1852.¹

Although the publishing of periodicals, books and pamphlets was a lucrative business for some printers, the newspaper printers found the job-printing business a necessary adjunct to the newspaper. "The local patronage of advertising and particular jobbing is the main support of a newspaper establishment, declared the Chicago daily."² [The Chicago American]

Printing for the government often provided the early printer with a living. The responsibilities connected with this work stimulated him to exercise care and thoughtfulness in typographical performance -- since volumes of laws and public documents came from the press of the early American government printer. As a result, the overall quality of their printing probably was improved.

Among the printers of the period, John Murphy was one of the most important. He came to America from Ireland before the age of eleven. A few years later he became an apprentice to a Philadelphia printer. About 1835, he moved to Baltimore and established a printing and stationery house. Within a few years, he had expanded his business to include the publication of books.

As a publishing house of high standards and laudable ideals, Murphy and Company did a substantial general business, although its specialty was Catholic books. Catholic writers, some of whom became prelates, owed Murphy a debt of gratitude, for he courageously undertook ponderous theological works for which there was a restricted market, and assured losses which were met by the profits from commercial printing and the sale of textbooks.³

Other outstanding printers were Fielding Lucas, Jr., whose work is said to have come the closest to approaching fine printing of any produced in Maryland during the period; Joseph Robinson, who specialized in Masonic reports and anti-Catholic tracts; William McNeir, George Johnston, and Jeremiah Hughes, all shared in the printing of official government documents; J. D. Toy, Woods & Crane, and Lucas and Deaver, who did much general book and pamphlet printing; and Johann Gruber, whose press at Hagerstown was the center of German publishing in Maryland.

Music printing had taken its place of importance in Baltimore as early as 1792;⁴ and, by 1840, there were many music printers. Three of the most important were Frederick D. Benteen, W. C. Peters, and George Willig.

The publication of organizational material -- minutes,

resolutions, reports, etc., also provided a lucrative business in which most of the Maryland printers had some share.
