That then such p<sup>ny</sup> shall forfeite the s<sup>d</sup> Corne soe concealed to the L<sup>d</sup> Prop<sup>r</sup> & be fyned in dowble the price of the s<sup>d</sup> Corne.

And it is further Ordered by the authority afores<sup>d</sup> That the Proclamaōn sett forth by the Gou<sup>r</sup> bearing date Nouemb<sup>r</sup> 8. 1647 concerning the Exportation of Corne out of the pro: As also the Preservation of the increase of the Stock of horses bee in full force & power untill it shall be repealed by the s<sup>d</sup> Gou<sup>r</sup>
