Loco + Sigilli Whereas sundry the Inhab<sup>ts</sup> of this pro: by Instigaōn of one Rich: Ingle, haue unfortunately runne themselves into a Rebellion ag<sup>t</sup> the L<sup>d</sup> Prop<sup>r</sup> of this pro: & therein haue committed diuers insolencies & robberies ag<sup>t</sup> the Lawes of the pro: But are now returned into Obedience againe & submitted themselves to his L<sup>ps</sup> gouern<sup>t</sup> I doe hereby in his L<sup>ps</sup> name by uertue of his Commis<sup>n</sup> in th<sup>t</sup> behalfe publish & graunt a grāll, absolute, & ffree Pardon unto euery & singular the Inhab<sup>ts</sup> residing w<sup>th</sup>in this pro: of all crimes of Rebellion, Seditiō & Plunder & of all other offences w<sup>soeu</sup>r of what nature soeu<sup>r</sup> committed w<sup>th</sup>in this pro: ag<sup>t</sup> the Lawes of the pro: from the 14<sup>th</sup> ffeb: 1644, unto the sixteenth day of Aprill last past. And of all Losses of life, lands, or goods & of all other penalties incurred by the s<sup>d</sup> Offences, or any of them. And I doe further declare in his L<sup>ps</sup> name, that Euery other person out of the pro: acknowledging Sorrow for his fact, & requyring Pardon, before the ffeast of S<sup>t</sup> Michael thee Archangell next, shall haue such Pardon graunted unto him, under my hand, & the seale of the pro: Excepting Rich: Ingle Marine<sup>r</sup> Gyū. att S<sup>t</sup> Maries 4<sup>o</sup> Mart: 1647

Proclamaōn

Whereas I am gyuen to understand of the enimies being actually on foote, intending (if possibly they may) to inuade us: And considering the daunger of the pnt times, & how troublesome & inconuenient it may proue, to diuers Inhab<sup>ts</sup> of this pro: & preiudiciall to the whole, to hold a Court in the beginning of June next; (especially all Causes being to be tryed by a Jury: w<sup>ch</sup> will much weaken those parts from whence they come) there being noe busines of th<sup>t</sup> consequence, or soe urgent, att this time, in the pro: to be heard & determined but
