Then was called John Everett to answere for his Contempt in Running from his Collors Pleades that he could not beare Armes ag^t the Indians for Conscience sake. Ordered that the said John Euerett be committed to the custody of Nicholas Guyther till 27th of November next and that then he be tryed by a Courte Marshall And that Cap^t John Collier come then to testefye in the case being the man that pressed the said Euerett.
