

Lib. H. D. happy deliverance from a late horrid Conspiracy together with
 Whitehall a proclamation for a thanksgiving day and severall other printed papers &c^a giving the concurrent Account of the said Conspiracy as also a paper of News rec^d from the hono^{ble} John Povey Esq^r one of the Clerks of his Ma^{ty}s most hono^{ble} privy Councill, setting forth the manner of the s^d Conspiracy; Ordered that M^r Speaker, the Burgesses and Justices of the Provincial Court (now in Town) be sent for to hear the same Read, and that Copyes of the said severall papers be prepared to be sent to the severall Counties of the province & published for prevention of false Reports, and that all the Clerks in Town be employed to write the same out, there being no printing press here (at present) employed.

Whitehall Ordered that a Proclamation be prepared for a day of publick thanksgiving for so rich Mercy extended to his Most sacred Ma^{ty} & Kingdoms, in the preservation of his person from the treacherous & wicked Attempts & designs of his Enemies; to be kept thursday next by all persons residing within the Port of Annapolis & that day Month after within all the Counties of the Province.

 Whitehall Afterwards produced & Read his Ma^{ty}s gracious & Royall Letter of the 2^d of Jan^{ry} last past vnto his Excell sent & directed signifying the Royall Command in Relation to the present assistance to be given to New York; Ordered that (for the generall satisfaction of the whole province) the heads of the s^d Letter be drawn forth, to be sent & published in the severall Counties of the province, which was accordingly done.
