I did intend to set out for Annapolis as to day, but the business I mentioned in my last not being yet brought before Congress,

owing to the Absence of Mr Witharspoon.

I have determind to stay all the week rather then leave this business unreported. I must therefore request the Senate (should I not be down in time) to chuse a President in my room. By thursday the 4th of Nov. if God Spares me I shall be down in the mean time I am with the greatest Affection & esteem
