

Lib. 41. Be it therefore Enacted by the Queens most Excellent Majesty by and with the Advice and Consent of her Majestys Governour Councill and Assembly of this Province and the Authority of the same that the said William Bladen may have  
 p. 208 and take to his Owne use to be employd towards the Re-building the Stadthouse all the bricks Iron work and timber aforesaid And that out of the publiq Stock of this Province shall be payd to the said William Bladen his Ex<sup>ts</sup> and Adm<sup>rs</sup> the sume of one thousand pounds Sterl or in Dollars or peices of Eight at four and six pence a piece as they now pass within this Province.

Provided this Act shall not take Effect till the said William Bladen hath given good security to his Excellency the Governour of two thousand pounds Sterl to perform the same within Eighteen months.
