We have herewith sent you her Majesty's Commands in her Letter of the 20<sup>th</sup> of October 1712 and her Order in Council of the 30<sup>th</sup> of March 1710 in ffavour of Sir Tho<sup>s</sup> Lawrence Bar<sup>t</sup> her Majesty's Secretary of this Province and earnestly recommend to you to demonstrate your Duty and Regard to her Most Sacred Majesty by your due Consideration
