Philip Lee and George Plater Esq^r are sent down to the Lower House to administer the Several oaths to the Governm^t appointed to be taken by Act of Assembly to the Several Members of that House; and ordered that the Clerk of this House Attend them, who administered the said Oaths to the several Members then Present. and they all Severally subscribed the oath of Abjuration and Test.

Col^t Ward & Benjamin Tasker Esq^r are sent to acquaint the lower House that his Excellency requires their Attendance in the Upper House immediately.
