It will therefore be necessary to have as much Flour, Bran and shorts delivered to M<sup>r</sup> Murdock as Colonel Wood the Commanding Officer shall direct. This we request may be done from the Mills most convenient, reserving as much as possible Flour in those Mills nearest to Baltimore, which you will send by the Waggon Colonel Wood may order there for Salt.
