The Troops at this Post are again without flesh Provisions and considering our pressing and express Directions to you to supply them without Delay, we cannot conjecture the Reason, for such Neglect, we again direct you to deliver the Cattle ordered in our Letter of the 11<sup>th</sup> Instant with an Addition of twenty more to M<sup>r</sup> Chrysal immediately; there will be no flesh to issue to the Troops tomorrow, we expect a supply from you by that Time; when the Cattle are delivered it will be necessary for you to attend and procure proper Pastures for them

The Troops at this Post have been several Times without flesh Provisions, we have to reiterate our Orders of the 11<sup>th</sup> Instant to forward immediately the Cattle, we are at a Loss to conjecture the Reason for such Delay, when you are sensible it is of so much Importance to have the Troops supplied with Provisions. If the Cattle agreeably to our Directions of the 9<sup>th</sup> June have not been sent to George Town we wish you not to send them and wait our further Orders.
