Your Petitioner has made Every offer to His Creditors that is in his power to performe Even the Indenting himself for a Servant all which is to no Purpose but your Petitioner must still continue a Prisoner. Your Petitioner is willing to surrender up all his Estate both real and Personal for the Benefit of his Creditors, And Humbly Pray Your Honours will take his Melancholy Condition into your Serious Consideration and Grant him Relief by an Act of Insolvency And your Petitioner as in Duty bound will ever Pray.
