An Act continuing an Act Entituled an Act for Amending the Staple of Tobacco for preventing Frauds in his Majestys Customs and for the Limitation of Officers fees.

Be it Enacted by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordships Governor and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly and the Authority of the same that an Act of Assembly of this Province Entituled an Act for amending the Staple of Tobacco for preventing Frauds in his Majestys Customs and for the Limitation of Officers fees made at a Session of Assembly begun and held at the City of Annapolis the fourth Day of October Seventeen Hundred and sixty Three be and is hereby continued and shall remain and be in full force untill the Twenty fifth Day of December One Thousand seven hundred and Sixty Nine
