MAY 1766

Liber H. S. At a Session of Assembly begun and held at the City of Annapolis  
 No. 1 on Friday the ninth Day of May in the sixteenth Year of the  
 1766 Dominion of the Right Honourable Frederick Absolute Lord and  
 p. 593 Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron  
 of Baltimore and so forth Anno Domini 1766 and ending the twenty  
 seventh Day of the same Month following.

 Horatio Sharpe Esquière Governor

No. 1 An Act continuing an Act entituled an Act to prevent disabled and  
 Superannuated Slaves being Set free, or the Manumission of Slaves

Be it Enacted by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary  
 by and With the advice and Consent of his Lordships Governor,  
 and the upper and Lower Houses of Assembly and the Authority  
 of the same That an Act of Assembly of this Province entituled, an  
 Act to prevent disabled and Superannuated Slaves being set free  
 Or the Manumission of Slaves, by any last Will or Testament, made  
 at a Session of Assembly begun and held at the City of Annapolis  
 the third day of June One thousand Seven hundred and Fifty two,  
 be and is hereby Continued and Shall remain and be in full Force  
 for and during the Term of Twenty Years and unto the end of the  
 next Session of Assembly which Shall happen after the Expiration  
 of the said Twenty Years

 Davis of the Same Place Blacksmith purporting that the said Daniel  
 Davis Should convey unto the same John Jeremiah Myar a good  
 sure indefeazable Estate of Inheritance in fee Simple of in and unto
