The humble Pet<sup>n</sup> of Thomas Mathews Attorney of M<sup>r</sup> Rich Couell of London. Sheweth

That whereas there was an Agrem<sup>t</sup> betweene M<sup>r</sup> Couell & Mr Batten for ye ualue of One hundd & six pownds, Seauen shillings & eleuen pence sterl. wch ye sd Mr Batten was to make present paymt for in Tob att 2<sup>d</sup> per pownd. All w<sup>ch</sup> w<sup>th</sup> a Case of drams att 200<sup>t</sup> the whole summe comes to 12967 of Tob in Cask. And hee only payd of it 9492<sup>t</sup>. And the Agreem<sup>t</sup> was That if y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Batten should not make paymt of all ye Tob, weh ye sd summe should amount to. That then hee should returne soe much of the goods back againe in kind, as should pay for ye Tob, that should bee behind. Now soe it is that there is behind 3475 of Tob not payd, nor any other Consideracon gyuen. Neyther in deed had Mr Batten att yt time any more Tob, yt was good to pay. Whereuppon Mr Batten causeth Mr Couell to bee arrested in an accon of ye Case about a man serut, sold some yeares formerly by Mr Couell to Mr Batten. wch was nothing consistant to this Agreem<sup>t</sup> or summe of Tob. But only y<sup>t</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Batten was pleased to make this an occasion for to bee a stop, yt hee might not make paymt of any more Tob att present. And the ship being ready to goe, the yeare being late, & his Seamen growing Sick, could not stay to answere Mr Battens suite, but appoynted mee his Attorney to answere in his behalfe. Wth I did. And according to Mr Battens request, wch was only for security concerning that man serv<sup>t</sup> formerly sold. I gaue him such security as hee
