

1 Internal organization could be improved gen-
2 erally. The atmosphere of a freedom of debate could be
3 established, an atmosphere which would be more cordial.

4 The facilities and staffing for the members,
5 the individual membership could be simplified. There is
6 quite a bit of difference between providing staffing for
7 an 80 member house, for the members themselves, than for
8 a 142 man house.

9 Now, with reference to bicameralism, we would
10 have a single member district representing approximately
11 50,000 people at the next census, and there would be a
12 justification for bicameralism because each district
13 would have two representatives.

14 One of the arguments against unicameralism
15 is that if you are not in favor with the particular single
16 representatives, there is no one to go to. It is almost
17 like being a citizen of the old Roman Empire. If you
18 weren't in favor with the emperor there was no place to
19 go, and this argument still applies to this particular
20 organization.
