Mr. Ford presented the petition of 392 citizens of Baltimore county, against the passage of a Hog Law;

Which was read and referred to the Baltimore county delegation.

Mr. Phelps presented a petition of a large number of the citizens of Dorchester county, praying the passage of an Act for the protection and preservation of the oyster beds in the waters of said county, and to prevent non-residents from dredging and taking away the oysters by force and violence;

Also, a petition of the President and Secretary of the Cambridge Female Academy, praying for the appropriation to the Academy of the proceeds of the sale of certain Indian Lands in said county therein set forth;
