

Art. III, § 14: Commencement of legislative session and annual sessions.

Art. III, § 15: Compensation of members to General Assembly and seventy day sessions.

Art. III, § 27: No bill to originate in the last twenty-eight days of a session.

Art. III, § 52(3): When governor must submit the budget bill.

Art. VI, § 3: Titled "Treasury Department", to allow deputy treasurer and deputy comptroller to sign and countersign bonds, certificates and other evidences of state debt.

Adds Art. XIF: Titled "Home Rule for Code Counties".

Proposed by Act of 1965, chapter 641.

Art. II, § 21: Titled "Executive Department"—to increase the salary of the governor and correct the wording of the section.

Art. XI, § 7: Titled "City of Baltimore"—relating to the procedure to be followed by the mayor and city council for the creation of a debt or credit.

Art. III, § 62: Giving the General Assembly the power to establish a Workmen's Compensation Commission.

Art. IV, § 26: Excepting Washington County from the provision that deputy clerks of court shall be removable by the judges for the respective courts for incompetency.

Art. III, § 40A: To provide municipal corporations in Cecil County with quick-taking authority for right of way for municipal roads.
