

## LIMITATION OF APPEALS.

- No writ of error or appeal shall be prosecuted upon any judgment after three years shall elapse from the time the judgment was rendered, except writs of error coram vobis—1826, ch. 200, sec. 13, . . . 887
- No appeal from any decree of a court of equity, shall be made nine months from the time the decree was passed, except the same was obtained by fraud—1826, ch. 200, sec. 14, . . . 887
- An appeal from a magistrate's judgment may be prosecuted within sixty days, (except in the city of Baltimore)—1829, ch. 236, . . . 996

## LOTTERY.\*

- Robbery or larceny of lottery tickets punishable in the same manner as of goods and chattels—1809, ch. 138, sec. 6, . . . 576
- Persons insuring, or causing to be insured any ticket or part of a ticket, in any lottery, or selling the same for any limited time, reserving any right or interest therein, or making any contract respecting the same, other than a complete bona fide sale, to forfeit \$30 for every offence—1809, ch. 154, . . . 590
- One-half to the informer, the other to the county, to be recovered before a justice as small debts are—1809, ch. 154, . . . 590
- Proceedings relative to lotteries previously granted—1817, ch. 154, . . . 673
- Penalty on the managers of any lottery offending against the provisions aforesaid—1817, ch. 154, sec. 1, p. 673; ch. 210, sec. 1, . . . 682
- The managers of all lotteries drawn in the state authorized and required to deduct from the prizes five per cent. in addition to that proposed by the scheme—1817, ch. 154, sec. 2, . . . 673
- The same to be paid within sixty days to the treasurer or the bonds of the managers to be put in suit—1817, ch. 154, sec. 2, . . . 673
- The governor and council authorized to appoint three persons as commissioners of lotteries, and to remove them at pleasure—1817, ch. 154, sec. 3, . . . 674
- Their salaries are to be paid out of the five per cent. and from no other moneys, by the treasurer—1817, ch. 154, sec. 3, . . . 674
- The commissioners authorized to appoint a clerk, with a salary payable in the same manner—1817, ch. 154, sec. 4, . . . 674
- Duties of the commissioners as to examining and approving schemes, and signing tickets, before a sale—1817, ch. 154, sec. 5, . . . 674
- All lotteries authorized by the state shall be drawn in the city of Baltimore, if desired by the managers, &c. and superintended by them, or their agents, with the assent of the commissioners—1817, ch. 154, sec. 6, . . . 674
