Y this Act of 1 Will. & Mar. c. 8. the Act of 1 Eliz. entituled, An Act to Oaths. i Will. & restore to the Crown the ancient Jurisdiction over the Estate-Ecclesiastical and Stat. 1 21: Mar. c. 8. Spiritual, and abolishing all Foreign Rowers repugnant to the same, commonly repealed.

called the Oaths of Supremacy; and also the Act of 3 Jac. 1. entituled, An Act for the hetter discouring and appealing Parish Processing Parish Paris for the better discovering and repressing Popish Recusants, commonly called the Oath of Allegiance shall from henceforth be repealed and made void for so much as concerns the faid Oaths.

And that the Oaths appointed by this present Act, shall after the first day of when to be May 1689. be taken by all such Persons as were required to take the said abro-taken. gated Oaths, before such Persons as in this Act expressed, That is to say, Every Before Archbishop and Bishop that now is, and every Person of and above the De-whom. gree of a Baron, in the Chancery or Kings Bench in open Court between the hours of nine and twelve in the Forenoon before the end of Trinity Term next, or at the General Quarter-Sessions between the first day of Angust next, all which shall be put on Record in the respective Courts. all other Persons shall take the said Oaths, and subscribe the said Declarations before fuch Person or Persons as by any Act or Acts were authorized to tender the faid Oaths of Allegiance now abrogated, and upon refusal to be liable to Punalties the Penalties, as by any fuch Statute was appointed for neglect or refufal of the faid abrogated Oaths

Archbishops, Bishops or any other of the Clergy, to take the Oaths before clirgy. the first of August 1689. or be suspended for six Months; And if after the said six Months shall neglect or resuse, then to be ipso fatto deprived.

And if any other Person or Persons (other than the Persons above mention-

ed) shall refuse to take the said Oaths when lawfully tendred, the Person or Persons tendring shall commit the said Person or Persons to the common Gaol, without Bail or Mainprize, for three Months, unless the Offender shall pay down fuch Sum of Mony, not exceeding 40 s. as the Persons tendring the said Oaths shall think fit, which Mony shall be paid to the Church-wardens, or Overfeers of the Poor of the Parish where the Offender last dwelt. And if at the end of the faid three Months the Person or Persons upon lawful tender shall again refuse, then to be committed, as aforesaid, for the space of six Months, unless they pay to the Tendrers such Sum of Mony as they shall require, not exceeding 10 l. nor under 5 l. to be disposed as aforesaid. And unless such Offender shall become bound with two Sureties to be of the Good Behaviour, and also to appear at the next Assizes, or General Gaol-delivery, at which Assizes, or Gaol-delivery the Oath shall be tendred, and upon refusal when again tendred, such Offender shall be adjudged incapable of any Office, Civil or Military, and shall remain bound to the Good Behaviour until he take the said Oaths. And if fuch Offender shall refuse to subscribe the Declaration mentioned in the Statute of 30 Car. 2. entituled, An Act for the more effectual preserving the Kings Person and Government, by disabling Papists from sitting in either House of Parliament, such Offender shall suffer such Penalties and Disabilities as a Popish Recufant convicted, &c.

Also the Statute of 13 Car. 2. entituled, An Act for ordering the Forces in the 13 Car. 2 feveral Counties of this Kingdom: And also so much of a Declaration prescribed not enjoyn-in an other Act, made the same year, entituled, An Act for the Uniformity of Publick Prayers, &c. shall not from henceforth be enjoyned, nor any Penalty suffered for not taking or subscribing the said Oath, or the said recited part of the faid Declaration.
