Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

And returned the Senate bill entitled an Act to require the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to take charge of and keep in repair all highways and bridges within the city limits.

"Endorsed by the House of Delegates, March 23, 1870," reported with proposed amendment; considered, proposed amendment rejected, and enacting clause stricken out.
