CHAP. 129. sioners be confirmed by the jury by this section directed to be summoned, the party or parties appealing shall pay the whole expense incurred thereby.

Not to be opened through any building, without consent of owner

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said commissioners shall not open the aforesaid road through any building, garden, orchard or meadow, of any person, without first obtaining his, her or their consent, in writing.

Commissioners compensation

4. AND BE IT ENACTED, That each of the said commissioners shall receive for their services two dollars for each day's necessary attendance, to be paid by the said Anthony Thompson, William M. Robertson, Charles Jones, Horatio Jones and Ezekiel Fitzchew.

CHAP. CXXX.

CHAP. CXXXI.

Passed Jan 28, 1814 *An Act to fix and regulate the quality of Silver Plate, manufactured and sold, or offered for sale, in the City of Baltimore, and for other purposes.* Lib. TH. No. 4, fol. 164

Plate, &c shall be stamped—Penalty

1. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the first day of August next, no silversmith, or other person whatsoever, shall sell, exchange, or expose or offer to sell or exchange, in the city of Baltimore, any silver vessel, plate, or manufacture of silver whatsoever, over the weight of five pennyweights, and less in fineness than eleven ounces pure silver to every pound troy, which shall not be stamped or marked in a conspicuous manner, with the stamp or mark of the assay officer, whose appointment is hereinafter provided for, upon pain that every such silversmith, or other person so offending, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay the sum of one hundred dollars, to be recovered and disposed of as hereinafter is directed, and for default of not paying down the penalty on conviction, shall be committed by the court in which judgment shall be given thereon to the common gaol of the county, there to remain and to be kept for any time not exceeding the space of twelve months nor less than six months, or until payment be made of the said forfeiture, and also upon pain that such silver vessel, plate, or manufacture of silver, which shall be sold, exchanged, or exposed or offered for sale or exchange, without having the stamp or mark thereon as by this act is hereinafter provided for, shall be forfeited, one moiety thereof to the mayor and city council of Baltimore, for the use of the said city, and the other moiety thereof to such person or persons who shall sue for and recover the same.

Silversmiths, &c. to send memorandums to assayer's office. His duty.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That from and after the first day of August aforesaid, every working silversmith, and other manufacturer of silver whatsoever, who shall at any time or times work or make, or cause to be wrought or made, any silver vessel, plate, or manufacture of silver whatsoever, by this act required to be marked or stamped by the assay officer as aforesaid, shall from time to time send, with every parcel of such silver, to his assay office, a
