

C H A P. III. **And be it enacted,** That the commissioners aforefaid shall ascertain and XI. value what damage fuch road running through any perfon's land as aforefaid shall amount to, which shall be paid to fuch perfon damaged as aforefaid by the faid Philip Shoal. Afcerain damage, &c.

Road not to go through orchards, &c. IV. **And be it enacted,** That the faid road shall not go through any orchard, garden or meadow, unlefs with the approbation of the owner.

C H A P. XIII.

An ACT to relieve nonjurors from certain difabilities.

Treble tax remitted, &c.

BE it enacted, by the general afsembly of Maryland, That the treble tax which nonjurors were liable to pay, and which has been heretofore fufpended by any act of afsembly, is hereby remitted, and the faid nonjurors are hereby for ever difcharged therefrom.

Part of an act repealed.

II. **And be it enacted,** That fo much of the faid act for the better fecurity of the government, as impofes a treble tax on nonjurors, be and is hereby repealed.

Methodifts not to be fined, &c.

III. **And be it enacted,** That no perfon of the feft, fociety or profefion, of the people called Methodifts, fhall be fined for preaching the Gofpel without taking the oath or affirmation prefcribed by the act for the better fecurity of the government, unlefs it fhall appear that fuch Methodift, by his actions and conduct, hath manifested a difpofition inimical to the prefent government.

C H A P. XVII.

An ACT for the more effectual paving the ftreets of Baltimore-town in Baltimore county, and for other purpofes.

Taxes to be levied, &c.

BE it enacted, by the general afsembly of Maryland, That the following taxes be levied in the town and upon the inhabitants of Baltimore-town, towards paving, cleaning, and keeping in repair, the ftreets, lanes and alleys, and for mending, building, and keeping in repair, the bridges within the faid town, viz. On every foot front of improved and unimproved lots in thofe parts of the ftreets fixed on to be paved, or that may have been already paved, by the fpecial commissioners appointed by an act, entitled, An act for the speedy application of the money appropriated for repairing the ftreets in Baltimore-town in Baltimore county, that is to fay, twelve fhillings and fix-pence; and on every foot front of improved and unimproved lots in thofe parts of the lanes and alleys paved or to be paved, fix fhillings and three-pence; for every four-wheeled riding carriage thirty fhillings per year; chairs or fulkeys fifteen fhillings per year; drays twenty-five fhillings per year; waggons and carts twenty-five fhillings per year; riding horfes twenty fhillings per year; an additional tax upon billiard tables of fifteen pounds per year; a tax upon the playhoufe of fifty pounds per year; an additional tax of thirty fhillings on every chimney catching fire; on perfons convicted in the county court of felling liquors without licence an additional fine of thirty fhillings; an additional tax of five pounds annually on tavern licences; a tax, not exceeding two fhillings and fix-pence, on every hundred pounds of affeffed property within faid town.
