Governor's Proclamation Declaring The Election of
Electors of President and Vice-President.

I, Emerson C. Harrington, Governor of the State of Maryland, in pursuance of Section 3 of the Act of Congress, approved February 3rd, 1887, do hereby certify that from a certified copy of the Declaration of the Result of an election held in the State of Maryland on Tuesday, November 7th, 1916, for eight Electors of President and Vice-President of the United States, made by the State Board of Canvassers in accordance with law and filed with me by the Secretary of State as required by the laws of Maryland, it appears that:
