

one person for bailiff; and that such judges of election before opening the polls shall take the oath before some justice of the peace to permit every qualified voter to vote, and none other; and a majority of said judges shall have power to do all things under this section in case one of them dies or refuses to act.

SEC. 15. *And be it enacted*, That at the election provided for in Section 14 of this Act each voter shall have written or printed on his ticket "For Incorporation" or "Against Incorporation;" and if a majority of the qualified voters in said town shall vote in favor of incorporation, then the provisions of this Act shall take effect and the election thereunder shall be valid; but if a majority of the said voters shall vote against incorporation, then this Act shall be void for a period of one year or until the third Monday of April, 1905, when the qualified voters of said town may assemble and vote as herein provided; and if at the second election a majority of the qualified voters of said town shall vote for incorporation, then the provisions of this Act shall take effect, and at the election thereunder shall be valid; and if a majority of said voters shall vote against incorporation at this election, then this Act shall be held void until the third Monday in April, 1906, when the qualified voters of said town may again assemble and vote as herein provided; and if a majority of the qualified voters of said town shall vote for incorporation, then the provisions of this Act shall take effect, and the election thereunder shall be valid; but if a majority of said voters shall vote against incorporation, then this Act shall be held utterly null and void.

SEC. 16. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 603.

AN ACT to legalize primary elections in Anne Arundel County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That political parties which, at the general election of November, 1903, polled ten per cent. of the entire vote cast in Anne Arundel County shall hereafter nominate their candidate for public office and elect all delegates to conventions or managing bodies in said political parties under the provisions of this Act and not otherwise.
