

for the fining and punishing all persons who shall hereafter keep, authorise, or suffer to be kept, any such bawdy-house, or bawdy-houses, or house, or houses of ill-fame, and all loose or suspected persons who shall live or reside in, resort to, or frequent any such bawdy-house, or bawdy-houses, or house, or houses of ill-fame, in said town.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That no ordinance of said corporation enacted and passed by virtue of this law, shall impose a fine of a greater sum than fifty dollars, or authorise a commitment to the common jail of said county, for a longer time than three months for any one offence. Limitations herein

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the Aldermen and Common-Council shall have full power and authority to enact and pass all laws and ordinances necessary to prohibit or restrain dogs from going at large in said Town, and for taxing them; and to provide a speedy remedy for the collection of taxes imposed by virtue of any ordinances passed by authority of this act. Authority in regard to dogs

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That it is hereby made the duty of the Sheriff of Frederick county, to receive and safe-keep in the jail of said county, all persons who shall hereafter be committed to said jail for a breach or violation of any of the ordinances of the corporation of said Town, according to the tenor of such commitment, and in the same manner and under the same regulations, as persons committed for a breach or violation of any of the laws of this State. SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That all laws or parts of laws, that are inconsistent with this act, be and the same are hereby repealed. Repealing clause
