Passed May 27, 1836. Resolution in favor of Granville S. Townsend, for the benefit of Mary Sproul, and others.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Granville S. Townsend, twenty dollars and forty-four cents, for the benefit of Mary Sproul and Nancy Lashly, the heirs and legal representatives of George Lashly, a revolutionary pensioner, deceased, which balance was due said Lashly at the time of his decease.

No. 108.

Passed June 1 Resolution in relation to the Eastern Shore Rail Road.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the commissioners appointed to survey the route of the Eastern Shore rail road, be and they are hereby required to cause to be surveyed the route leading from the village of Quantico, in Somerset county, to Saulsbury, thence to Princess Ann, with a view of obviating the necessity of bridging Wicomico River, and adopting that route which will subserve the best interest of the community, and will be attended with the least expense; *And be it further resolved*, That the said commissioners shall cause to be surveyed the route of a lateral road, to depart at the most convenient point on the proposed Eastern Shore rail road, and running from such point to or near the town of Centreville, and from thence passing through the most level land of Queen Ann's and Talbot counties, to or near the town of Easton, and also the route of a lateral road, running from the most convenient point on the said rail road, to or near the town of Cambridge, and
