To His Excellency, Wm. T. Hamilton,

Governor of Maryland:

This is my Fifth Annual Report, embracing the operations of the Treasury Department for the fiscal year ended the 30th day of September, 1882, respectfully submitted. In the Statements and Tables to be found in the Appendix, is set forth everything required to be stated. A synopsis and comparison with other years may, however, not be out of place.

The receipts into the Treasury, during last year, were \$1,924,481.47, and less than the receipts of the year previous, by the sum of \$72,159.61. The balance in the Treasury proper, at the end of the year, was \$638,506.63; add to this the cash to the credit of the Free School Fund, \$18,520.47, and to credit of the General Sinking Fund, \$495.46, and the total amount in the Treasury, in cash, shows \$657,522.56, being less than the previous year by \$129,098.68, and a diminution of the balance in the Treasury proper to the extent of \$113,691.66. The investments made during the year, in bonds of the State, amount to \$188,289.18, of which \$25,890,00 were placed
