

## CHAPTER 623.

AN ACT to pay Martha Hopp, administratrix of Reuben Morrison, deceased, a sum of money for State taxes erroneously paid into the Treasury by her.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Treasurer, upon the warrant of the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Martha Hopp, administratrix of Reuben Morrison, deceased, of Frederick county, Maryland, the sum of ten dollars and seventeen cents, the same having been erroneously paid by her into the Treasury, and certified as paid on property unlawfully, and its repayment being recommended by the Comptroller of the Treasury.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 624.

AN ACT to amend section 9 of Article 5, title "Attorney-General and State's Attorneys" of the Constitution of this State, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland* (three-fifths of all members of each of the two houses concurring), That the following section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to section 9 of Article 5, title "Attorney-General and State's Attorneys," of the Constitution of this State, and if adopted by the legal qualified voters thereof, as herein provided, said section shall supersede and stand in the place and in stead of section 9 of said Article 5 of the Constitution of Maryland.

9. The State's Attorney shall perform such duties and receive such fees and commissions or salary, not exceeding three thousand dollars, as are now or may hereafter be prescribed by law; and if any State's Attorney shall receive any other fee or reward than such as is or may be allowed by law, he shall, on conviction thereof, be removed from office; provided, that the State's Attorney for Baltimore City shall receive an annual salary of fifty-four hundred dollars, and shall have power to appoint one deputy at an annual salary not exceeding four thou-
