

CHAP. 221.

Repeal

On confirmation

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That all such parts of the Constitution and form of government, as are inconsistent with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed; *Provided*, this act shall be published at least three months before a new election, and shall be confirmed by the General Assembly, after the next election of Delegates, in the first session after such new election, as the said constitution and form of government directs.

CHAPTER 220.

Passed Mar. 17, 1835

A supplement to the act, entitled, an act to establish permanent Salaries for the Judges of the six Judicial Districts in this State:

§300 additional

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals of this State, shall receive, in addition to the sum now allowed by law, the sum of three hundred dollars per annum, and the Treasurer of the Western Shore shall be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to pay quarterly, out of any unappropriated money which may be in the Treasury, to the said Chief Judge, the said additional sum of three hundred dollars.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Margaret Calahan, of Frederick County, be, and she is hereby divorced from her husband, Patrick Calahan, a vinculo matrimonii.
