BANK OF COMMERCE.

AN ACT authorizing the Bank of Commerce to cancel four thousand shares of their Capital Stock.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Bank of Commerce be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to cancel, annul and make void, four thousand shares of their capital stock which now represent a portion of their assets.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the cancelling of the aforesaid shares of capital stock, as named in the first section of this act, shall, in no way whatever, affect the rights, privileges and restrictions of said Bank of Commerce, under each and every existing law, but shall be in effect as though the said shares of capital stock had never had an existence.

SEC 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

BALTIMORE TOBACCO WORKS.

AN ACT to incorporate the Baltimore Tobacco Works.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That John Dekremelberg, William Kennedy, Werner Dresel, Benjamin Deford, and William Lamping, their associates, successors, and assigns, be and they are hereby created a body corporate, by the name and style of the Baltimore Tobacco Works, and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be capable in law to hold and dispose of property, real, personal or mixed, fee simple or leasehold, to sue and be sued, to plead and be impleaded, answer and defend, and be answered and defended in any courts of law or equity, and in any other place whatsoever, to receive and make deeds and contracts, to make, have and use a common seal, and the same to change, alter and renew at pleasure; to ordain and establish such by-laws, ordinances, and regulations as may appear necessary for regulating the concerns of said corpora-
