

8. Should a majority of the votes cast at an election held, as provided in the first section of this act, be unfavorable to the issuing of the said license, it shall not be lawful for the said clerk of the Circuit Court, to issue any license for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors of any kind within the limits of said borough, for one year from the first day of May ensuing said decision, in each and every year in which such decision shall be made.

#### PORT DEPOSIT.

Chapter 226 amends and re-enacts Sections 146, 152, 160, as follows.

9. The limits of said village shall commence on the Susquehanna river, at the eastern terminus of the old Port Deposit bridge, and run thence due east one-quarter of a mile, then southerly in a parallel line with the river, until it strikes a run called Herring Run, then down the said run to the Susquehanna river, and then by and with the river to the place of beginning.

10. They shall have power to levy and collect taxes in said village, not exceeding in any one year, thirty cents in the hundred dollars on the assessable property of said village; and shall also, for the purpose of grading and paving the streets of said village, have power to levy such other taxes upon the property fronting on the street, or the portion thereof to be paved, as will pay the cost of grading and paving the same.

11. The president and commissioners of the village of Port Deposit, shall have full power to pave the streets of said village, and shall assess and levy the expense thereof upon the owners of the property fronting on that portion of the street to be
