INHERITANCE.

Descents.

1. Lands held in fee simple ; fee simple conditional or fee tail general, how to descend.

25. Party to inherit, except children, to be in being at death of intestate
26. No distinction to be made between brothers and sisters of the whole and half blood
27. Child or children to take by representation.
28. Entails created before January 1, 1788.
29. Child legitimized by subsequent marriage of parents, and acknowledgment by father.
30. Inheritance among illegitimate children.

Division and Election.

Election.

50. Election or refusal may be in writing.
- 51 Person electing to take shall give bond to other persons.

Sales by Commissioners.

52. If all parties refuse to elect, lands shall be sold by commissioners.
53. Where all parties are minors, estate not to be sold until eldest arrives at age.
54. Bonds for the purchase money payable to each representative.
