In the Name of God I men the twelveth day of January one thousand five hundred eighty & nine,) William Coulbourne of Colbourne in my County of Somerset and Province of Maryland gone being full of body but of perfect memory and remembrance blessed be he yet calling to mind my mortal estate of this transitory life doe make constittute and ordain this my last will and testamant in manner and forme following revoking and disbanelling all former and other wills by these presents by me made and thise only and none other to be my last will & testamant dñe first being penitent and heartily sorry for all my sin past I doe Comitt my soule unto almighty god in hope through the meritorious death and passion of jesus Christ my saviour to receive full pardon and forgiveness of the same next I Comitt my body to ye earth to be buried in aderent Christian manner according to direction of my executors hereafter named And also the settling of my temporall estate whiche it hath pleased god to bestow upon me far beyond my deserts I doe give & bequeath in manner & forme following But first I will that all those debts and legacies I owe in right and conscience to any manner of Person or persons whatsoever shall be well and truly paid within convenient time after my decease First I give & bequeath unto my eldest sonn William Coulbourne my self and sole executors the

plantation whereon I live now and all the land belonging thereto excepting two parcels of land with three negroes wizt Emanuel Betty and Abraham ab also my owne horse saddle bridle pistolls and holsters one prest standing in the outer roome with the table and sette bridled a pair of Andros & one Chest of drawars in the inward corner roome six draughts open with Plow &器具 belonging
Secondly I doe give & bequeath unto my sonn Robert Coulbourne one parcel of land called Harts cap containing two hundred acres and another parcel of land called Harts Content containing fifty acres to him & his heires for ever also one negro called Jack with one young foal horse with ablaze downe his face with one Chest of drawars being in the chamber with two thousand pounds of tobacco

Thirdly I doe give and bequeath unto my daughter Anne Taylor and John Taylor and to the heirs of their bodies for ever one parcel of land which the said John Taylor has leased upon beginning at a markd oak deuiding it from my sonn William Land and so running alonge backe to the land I formerly gave my daughter Penelope with one Molitta boy called Will and one mare called Sweet Lips and besides that my granddaughter Dorothy Marie his first Marke and also give my sonn grandaughters Anne, Jane, Dorothy and Mary Taylor each of them one Cow calfe and Dorothy one ewe lamb

Fifthly Also to my daughter Anne Taylor I give one haufoot Chest and one Chest more whatsoeuer she haue with two thousand pounds of tobacco

Sixthly I give & bequeath unto my daughter Penelope Hollated one huse of brick and tile power in fullnes the full of her deuise and portage
Seventhly I further give unto my aforesaid sonn William Coulbourne my huse that is in towne ab also my feather bed slye on with its furniture thereof belonging with abell Mells Pott and two Brass pottes I then give unto my granddaughter Anne Coulbourne one yearling heifer

Eighthly I give unto my sonn John West one horse and calfe

Ninethly I doe desire that what other personall estate is left when the legacies are paid be equally devided amongst my two sonnb and daughter wife William Robert and Anne

Hundredthly It is my will & desir that my sonn Robert & John Taylor haue the privilege of my great estate for their retaine during their life times they helping to kepe the same in repair

you the said William Coulbourne full power and discretiō to administer all singular
the goods chattels and creditts of the said deceased and to demand payement and leavy
and in Legall manner require and recarie all and all manner of debt and debtes
due & owing to the said deceased and well & faithfully to disposse of the same and out of
the goods chattels & creditts of the said deceased whiche haue may or shall come to you
hands or possession well & truly to pay the debts due by the said deceased to his friend
as the same will appear and the law will Range you according to the true value of
