

1 MR. MELVIN: Second.

2 THE CHAIRMAN: All in favor, say Aye, opposed,
3 No. It is carried.

4 MR. MELVIN: I assume we are going to have some-
5 thing in there, in the constitution, to indicate the
6 present boundaries will remain as they are until change is
7 provided by the constitution?

8 THE CHAIRMAN: I think we would have to make
9 that provision, yes.

10 To more directly answer Dr. Loevy's question,
11 I would like for Dr. Loevy and Mr. Howard to get together
12 with Mr. Brooks and give us this third alternative we have
13 been speaking about, because I must confess I am a little
14 confused as to what it is, because I can only see two,
15 but I would like to get that third one in writing. I would
16 like to have that available to us at the next meeting.

17 MR. BROOKS: I wanted to introduce John Ellwood.
18 I don't think I introduced him earlier. He is a research
19 assistant, working with the Committee, a graduate student
20 of Johns Hopkins University. We are glad to have him with
21 us today.
