2 little different function than your committees because
3 while ultimately they will adopt specific language and
4 submit it to the full Commission, at the moment they are
5 gatherers of facts and views to present to the full
6 Commission and to embody hopefully in a series of mono-
7 graphs that will preserve for the use of the public and
8 the use of the Constitutional Convention ultimately the
9 views of all groups that are interested in the various
10 aspects of the Constitution.

11 So that we do not always have a court reporter
12 present at these sessions, simply because our budget does
13 not permit it. We regard this session with you as im-
14 portant enough to go to the expense of having a court
15 reporter, so that we can see that every member of the
16 Commission has a written record of what he has said
17 tonight for study and consideration. In addition to
18 that, of course, the members of the Committee who are
19 here tonight will have the opportunity to exchange views
20 with you, but more importantly, and this is the real
21 purpose of it, is to elicit your views on some of the
