A resolution in favor of Washington G. Tuck, providing for the payment of the balance due. Passed February 11 1828

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised to pay to Washington G. Tuck, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the sum of one thousand three hundred and eighty nine dollars and ninety eight cents, it being the full balance due for covering the State House, over and above the appropriation made by the last legislature. \$1,389 08

A resolution in favor of Thomas White, of Baltimore County. Passed February 8 1828

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Thomas White, of Baltimore county, or to his order, during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war. Half pay of private
