Joint Resolution requesting the Governor to appoint a commission to report upon the subject of placing statues of distinguished citizens of Maryland in the National Hall of Statuary in the Capitol of the United States at Washington.

Preamble.

Whereas, By an act of Congress approved July 2, 1864, (Revised Statutes of the United States, section 1814), the old Hall of the House of Representatives in the Capitol at Washington was set apart as a National Hall of Statuary, and each of the several States of the Union was invited to place therein two statues of deceased persons who have been citizens of such State, and illustrious for their historic renown or for distinguished civic or military services; and
