LAWS OF MARYLAND.

Maryland, Sct:

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held at the City of Annapolis, on the third day of December, 1861, His Excellency, THOMAS H. HICKS, being Governor, and ended on the tenth day of March, 1862, His Excellency, AUGUSTUS W. BRADFORD, being Governor, the following Laws were enacted, to wit:

CHAPTER 1.

AN ACT to authorize the Commissioners of Mont-Passed Dec. gomery County to raise money for the purpose of building a Jail.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Commission-of Maryland, That the Commissioners of Mont-ers authorized gomery county be and they are hereby authorized ney to build a and empowered to borrow, upon the credit of the jail. county, a sum of money not exceeding five thousand dollars, for the purpose of building a jail.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That the said Tax may be Commissioners may and they are hereby authorized off loan. to levy upon said county, a tax on the assessable property of said county, to reimburse the said loan, not more than one thousand dollars, and interest to be raised in any one year, until the said loan is paid off.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That the said Plans, &c., Commissioners be and they are hereby authorized for erection of to adopt such plans and make such contracts, and do all other acts necessary in the erection and completion of the said jail, with as little delay as practicable.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That said law shall Inforce. take effect upon its passage.
