No. 14.

A Resolution in favour of William R. King, of Frederick Passed Feb 16, 1828
county.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to William R. King, of Frederick county, or his order, one hundred dollars, being the amount of a fine imposed on him by Frederick county court, and paid into the treasury, which was remitted by the executive of the state.

No. 15.

A Resolution authorising an appropriation of a sum of money for the purposes of furnishing and making the necessary repairs of the Government House. Passed Feb 11, 1828

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore do pay to the order of his excellency Daniel Martin, any sum, not exceeding one thousand dollars, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated; the said sum to be applied towards the furnishing, and making the necessary repairs of the government house, and to be accounted for accordingly.

No. 16.

A Resolution authorising the joint committee upon the subject of the Chancery Records, to issue subpoenas for Witnesses, and so forth. Passed Feb 18, 1828

Resolved, That the joint committee of the two houses upon the subject of the chancery records, be authorised to issue subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses, and to send for papers and records.

No. 17.

A Resolution, with its preamble, authorising certain Records in the Western Shore Land Office to be rebound. Passed Feb 16 1828
