CHAPTER 7.

*An act to alter the law in relation to the compensation of Judges of Elections in the city of Baltimore.*

Passed Jan 28, 1839

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That hereafter, no Judge of an Election in the city of Baltimore shall be allowed any compensation for making the return of such election; *Provided*, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to deprive any Judge of an Election of the compensation now allowed for attending the same.

CHAPTER 8.
