Passed Mar. 20, 1835

Resolution in favor of Dennis Boyd, and his securities.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the proceedings upon a judgment obtained by the State of Maryland, against Dennis Boyd and his securities, be suspended, and shall be entered in favor upon payment by the said Boyd into the Treasury of the Western Shore, on or before the first day of May next, one third of the said debt, with interest on the whole debt, at six per cent per annum, and all costs; one other third part with all the interest, at six per cent per annum, on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty six, and the residue, with six per cent interest, on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty seven.

And be it further resolved, That on the failure of the said Dennis Boyd to comply with any of the terms of the foregoing resolution, the same shall have no effect and operation, and execution may be issued for the debt, interest and costs in the same manner as if the resolution aforesaid had not been passed.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Henry Cooke, a Revolutionary soldier, the half pay of a private, in quarterly payments, during his life.
