The said Patrick at last Court on the same recognizance in the sum of thirty pounds Sterling for his appearance to this Court to answer unto what should be objected against him on a writ of Habeas Corpus. The said Hanson one of the Justices of this Court. The said Patrick at this Court appears to the same order by the Court here that the same be discharged. This Court here discharges the same recognizance no person showing any cause to the contrary and also a certain writ of Habeas Corpus in the sum of thirty pounds Sterling is by this Court here discharged

On the said Patrick in his proper person comes into Court and appears and the said Fred. Hanson goes against the same Patrick and the said Fred. Hanson informs the Court the abuse he did as a Justice of the Peace in the said County from the said Patrick. And the said Patrick says that he cannot gainsay the allegation of the said Mr. Hanson. But that he is guilty as above charged and thereupon submits to the Court. Therefore it is considered by the Justice here to wit at the Court House in the Town of West. in said County on the third Tuesday in August being the thirtieth day of said Month Anno Domini 1730 hundred and thirty. That the said Patrick pay the sum of five hundred pounds of Tobacco as a fine to the use of the Free School of said County for his committing the offence according to his confession and according to Act of Assembly in such case made and provided. And also pay the sum of one hundred eighty one pounds of Tobacco for maintaining on the premises and to the officers of this Court
