Likewise came into Court Arthur Barker of said County Planter and acknowledged himselfe Indebted to The Right Hon^{ble} the Lord Proprietarie in the sum of ten pounds Sterl to be levied on his goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the said John Hall shall not appear at the next Novemb^r Court to be held for said County to answer unto what shall be objected against him on account of his Stealing Indian Corn from the afo Nicholas Hoale and in the mean time he is to be of good behav^r wherewith he acknowledges himselfe to be Content
